Young Pacific Squad Opens With Solid Performances

A young Pacific men's wrestling squad opened the 2009-10 season with a number of solid performances over the weekend at their own Mike Clock Open. The Boxers return to tournament action this weekend, taking part in the Southern Oregon Open on Friday and Saturday at Southern Oregon University in Ashland.

Boxer Bytes

- Pacific saw 11 of their 15 wrestlers open the season over the weekend, competing in their own Mike Clock Open at the Pacific Athletic Center.
- Senior **Nathan Shay** was the only placer for the Boxers, finishing in sixth place in the 165-pound bracket after going 2-3.
- Sophomore **Andy Duncan** had the most wins for Pacific at the Mike Clock Open, going 3-2 in the 141-pound bracket after winning just four matches as a freshman.
- Junior **Kody Kramer** also won two matches for the Boxers at 149 pounds while freshman **Ken Hyland** went 2-2 in the 157-pound bracket.
- The Southern Oregon Open will be the second of a string of three straight tournaments that Pacific will compete in to begin the season. The Boxers will compete at the Nov. 21 Northwest Collegiate Wrestling Tournament in Spokane before their first duals of the season, Nov. 29 against Oregon State and Simon Fraser.

About This Week's Tournament



SOUTHERN OREGON OPEN

Formerly the Best of the West Open, the Southern Oregon Tournament will feature many of the same programs that competed in the Mike Clock Open, including Clackamas CC, Southwestern Oregon CC, Highline CC, Yakima Valley CC, the Portland State club as well as unattached wrestlers from Oregon State. Pacific sent four wrestlers to last year's Best of the West Open, which took place at the Jackson County Expo Center in Central Point (20 miles north of Ashland). **Andrew Wolfe** (Sr., Milwaukie, Ore.) and **Kody Kramer** (Jr., Oroville, Wash.) each won one match for the Boxers.

Pacific News & Notes

STARTING OFF THE SHAY WAY: Nathan Shay (Sr., Gresham, Ore.) got his final season for the Boxers off to a good start, finishing as Pacific's only placer at the Mike Clock Open. Shay finished in sixth place in the 165-pound bracket, compiling a record of 2-3. Shay won his first matches of the tournament, scoring a 12-2 major decision over Cerritos JC's Alfonso Estrada and advanced to the semifinals with a 4-2 overtime victory over Clackamas CC's Derek Mestrovich. Shay was then relegated to the consolation bracket with a 7-3 loss to Cerritos JC's Eric Sauvageau and eventually took a 12-3 major decision loss to Highline CC's Tyler Story in the fifth place final. The effort is a good start for Shay, who finished the 2008-09 season with 9-17 record with matches at both 165 and 174 pounds.

DUNCAN HIS WAY TO THREE WINS: Andy Duncan (So., Everett, Wash.) finished his freshman season with just four wins. After one weekend, he needs just one more victory to match that total. Despite not placing, Duncan came away with three victories in the 141-pound bracket at the Mike Clock Open. Duncan opened the tourney with a third round fall over John Bake. After taking a loss by pin to Clackamas CC's Anthony Weerheim, Duncan came back to win a pair of close decisions over Matt Pride of Southwestern Oregon CC (3-1) and Chris Pena of Yakima Valley CC (1-0). Duncan finished one match away from competing in either the third or fifth place match, taking a 44 second pin Clackamas CC's Mitch Giberson.

KODY WINS A PAIR: Kody Kramer also opened his season with a pair of wins at the Mike Clock Open. Kramer rebounded from a first round loss to Highline CC's Jason Gray to win his first two matches of the consolation bracket at 149 pounds, pinning Yakima Valley CC's Cameron Anthony in 96 seconds and beating Yakima Valley's Richard Quesada in a 4-1 decision. Kramer led Pacific in 2008-09 with a 16-19 record. He also went 2-2 in last year's Mike Clock Open.

STRONG START FOR A NEWCOMER: Ken Hyland (Fr., Medford, Ore.) had the best start of any of the 10 newcomers to the Pacific program. Hyland went 2-2 in the 157-pound weight class at the Mike Clock Open. He won his first collegiate match, scoring a 9-1 major decision over John Hedge of Southern Oregon in the opening round before taking an 8-3 decision to Bronson Gerl of Cerritos JC. Hyland came back to win a 7-2 decision over Joel Veloni of Yakima Valley CC. Hyland is a product of South Medford High School. He was a three-time state meet qualifier for the Panthers and finished fourth at the Oregon state championships in 2009 at 160 pounds.

GOING OVERTIME: Going overtime in matches can be a sign of being evenly matched and being competitive against your opponent. Last year, the Boxers saw a total of three matches go to overtime. In the first weekend of the 2009-10 season, Pacific has seen two matches go to extra time. **Nathan Shay** earned an overtime win at 165 pounds in a 4-2 decision over Clackamas CC's Derek Mestrovich. **Zach Binkerd** (Fr., Hillsboro, Ore.) took an overtime loss in his first collegiate match, falling 11-9 to Clackamas CC's Jimmy Miller.

Pacific News & Notes

HALL OF FAME PEDIGREE: One of Pacific's newest wrestlers brings with him a degree of Hall of Fame pedigree. **Zach Binkerd** is in his first season at Pacific. His father, **Kevin Binkerd**, was a Hall of Fame wrestler for the Boxers. Kevin Binkerd was a 1982 NAIA All-American for the Boxers, finishing as the national runner-up at 126 pounds. Kevin was also a two-time NAIA District II champion and won the 1979 Northwest Conference championship at 126 pounds. Kevin Binkerd was inducted into the Pacific Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000. Zach Binkerd, however, brings a lot more than his father's name back to Pacific. Zach is a four-time Oregon high school state championships qualifier while competing for nearby Hillsboro High School and was the state runner-up each of the last two years at 119 pounds. Zach amassed a 106-22 record as a prep wrestler.

LATE COMER: Pacific will be at least one more week without one of its top returners from last year. **John Cushman** (So., Lakewood, Wash.), who won eight matches as a freshman at 125 pounds, is finishing up the cross country season for the Boxers before transitioning to the mat. Cushman will be one of seven Pacific men to compete at the NCAA Division III West Region Cross Country Championships, which take place in Claremont, Calif. Cushman is a two-year member of the Pacific cross country team and was the team's No. 4 runner at the Oct. 31 Northwest Conference Championships. He ran a season best of 28:27.56 over 8,000 meters.
