After a week off, the Missouri wrestling team returns to action this Sunday, Jan. 30, at the Hearn Center, as they take on the No. 16 Nebraska Cornhuskers at 1 p.m. CT in the Big 12 Conference opener.

The match will be featured as "Wrestling Supporting Wrestling," with all ticket proceeds from the event going directly to the Missouri wrestling scholarship fund. Tickets are \$5 each and can be purchased at the Hearn Center on the day of the match or by calling 1-800-CAT-PAWS.

Wrestling Supporting Wrestling is a concept that was derived by head coach Brian Smith a few years ago, and is based on the idea of turning the program into a self-provider while the program is thriving. Since 2008, the Tigers have had 10 All-Americans and two NCAA National Champions in Mark Ellis and Max Askren. Missouri has also finished within the top-15 of the final rankings in each of the last seven seasons.

## SCOUTING NEBRASKA

The No. 16 Nebraska Cornhuskers, sporting a 10-3 dual record, come to Columbia for possibly the last time this Sunday. Winners of four of their last five, Nebraska's dual with Missouri will be their seventh road contest in the past two weeks. The Huskers face off against No. 11 Oklahoma on Friday evening to open their Big 12 schedule.

Nebraska has defeated two teams who are currently in the NWCA Top 25, as they knocked off No. 25 Wyoming on Dec. 4 by a 20-12 score and No. 20 Oregon State, 17-16. They finished ninth at the Midlands with 63 points and then swept through the Lone Star Duals on Jan. 15, beating Utah Valley, Stanford and Brown. Last weekend, the Cornhuskers fell to No. 3 Wisconsin, 22-15, before bouncing back and defeating Northern Iowa by an 18-15 final.

The Huskers hold the all-time edge over the Tigers with a 38-17-3 record. Missouri won last year's meeting in Lincoln by a 22-16 final. Nebraska is led by head coach Mark Manning, now in his 11th season.

### MARQUEE MATCHUPS

Of course a conference dual meet between two Big 12 schools is intriguing enough as is, however there are three matches that stand out above the rest this Sunday. First, at 165, Missouri's Zach Toal, ranked as high as No. 11 in the country, goes up against the top ranked wrestler in the class in Jordan Burroughs. Burroughs, who is 23-0 on the season and 13-0 in dual matches, has picked up bonus points in every match but one this year. He's recorded six pins, nine technical falls, four major decisions and three wins by forfeit or default. His lone decision came in a 10-7 win over then-No. 1 Andrew Howe of Wisconsin. He picked up a technical fall win over No. 12 Cody Yohn of Minnesota, winning 23-7, and has also majored No. 16 Ryan DesRoches of Cal Poly by a 20-8 score.

At 184 pounds, No. 15 Mike Larson is expected to go up against No. 13 Josh Ihnen, who currently sits at 19-6 on the year and 9-4 in duals. Five of his six losses have come against top-15 competition, as he lost in overtime to No. 5 Joe LeBlanc of Wyoming (5-3), by decision to Minnesota's Kevin Steinhaus, ranked No. 9 (3-2), twice to No. 3 Travis Rutt of Wisconsin, falling 4-3 and 3-2, and by a 5-0 decision to No. 12 Ryan Loder of Northern Iowa. His big statement win of the year was in overtime against Grant Gambrell of Iowa, ranked No. 16 currently, as Ihnen won 4-3 at the Midlands.

Missouri heavyweight Dom Bradley will take on No. 11 Tucker Lane, who is 19-4 on the season and 10-3 in duals. Three of his losses have come against top-11 competitors, falling to No. 7 Ryan Tomei of Pittsburgh, 4-1, No. 9 Tony Nelson of Minnesota, 3-1 in sudden victory, and No. 11 Eric Bugenhagen of Wisconsin in the second tiebreaker, 2-1. His other loss came to unranked John Helgerson of Wartburg, falling 4-3. His big wins of the year came against No. 13 Christian Brantley of Northern Iowa, and No. 16 Clayton Jack of Oregon State. Lane defeated both Brantley and Jack by 2-0 scores.

Missouri returns to the road next weekend to take on a pair of Big 12 opponents, beginning with Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Okla., at 7 p.m. CT on Friday, Feb. 4. The following day, Mizzou will take on the Oklahoma Sooners in Norman, Okla., at 3 p.m. CT.

### EARLY POINTS HELPING TIGERS

Much of the Tigers' success this season has been because of the big wins they've had right off the bat in their dual meets. More specifically, the success they've had at 125, 133 and 141 pounds. The Tigers have scored 446 total team points in duals this season, and 183 of those have come from the first three weight classes, making up over 41% of the team's total. Mizzou has accumulated 47 points at 133 pounds, 64 points at 125 and 72 points at 141. The only other class to pick up more points than 47 is heavyweight, which has accumulated 50 points so far this season. 125 pounds has picked up bonus points in four of their 18 wins, while 133 has scored bonus point wins in six of their 19 matches. 141 pounds leads the way, picking up bonus points in 11 of their 17 victories on the season. Missouri has started every match at 125 pounds this year.

### SECOND HALF SHIFT

After struggling through much of the year at the 157 and 197-pound classes, the additions of Nick Gregoris and Brent Haynes into those respective weights have helped turn the tide a bit for the Tigers. After 10 duals this season, Missouri only had recorded 9 points at 157 and 13 points at 197. Since Gregoris and Haynes joined the lineup, Mizzou has picked up 13 points at 157 pounds and 23 points at 197 pounds during the team's last nine duals.

### SEVEN TIGERS TAKE TITLES AT OPEN

Thirteen Tiger wrestlers competed in the Roger Denker Open at the University of Central Missouri on Saturday, with 12 coming back having placed in the event.

Dustin Williams (184), Ryan Robinson (197) and Jake Glore (HWT) completed perfect days to take home the title in their respective weight classes. Luke Cherep (141), Ty Prazma (165) and Devin Mellon (HWT) each earned runner-up finishes, while Simon Kitzis (141) and Johnny Eblen (184) finished sixth.

### NO. 7 MIZZOU SWEEPS PAIR OF DUALS

The No. 7 Tiger wrestling team improved to 14-5 on the dual season, closing out their non-conference schedule with a pair of victories during the fifth annual Beauty and the Beast competition. Mizzou opened things up with a 29-9 win over Chattanooga before shutting out SIU-Edwardsville by a 48-0 final to close the day.

Missouri jumped out to a 13-0 lead over the Mocs after the first three matches behind a decision from freshman Alan Waters and a pair of technical falls from sophomore Nathan McCormick and senior Todd Schavrien.

Chattanooga got back in the match with a decision and a win by fall at 149 and 157, respectively, but the Tigers rallied off four straight decisions before junior Dom Bradley's major decision at heavyweight to put things out of reach.

Redshirt freshman Zach Toal and junior Dorian Henderson won their duals by a 5-2 score, while sophomore Mike Larson picked up a 3-2 victory over his opponent. Sophomore Brent Haynes shut out Robert Prigmore, 6-0, and Bradley picked up the major with a 10-2 final. Bradley's second bonus point dual victory of the year closed out the dual, as he took down Matt Lettner four times during the match. A stall warning point in Bradley's favor, along with 1:55 in riding time, added four points to the Missouri team score.

Mizzou followed that win up with a 48-0 thumping of SIU-Edwardsville, the second shutout for the Tigers this season. Missouri beat Lindenwood 41-0 to open the home portion of the schedule back on Nov. 21.

The Tigers opened things up by getting pins in the first three matches. Waters pinned his opponent in 1:36, while McCormick stuck his opponent in 1:53. Schavrien made it 18-0 Tigers with another first period fall, getting the pin 2:13.

The Tigers got a decision at 149 and back-to-back majors at 157 and 165. Henderson kept things rolling with a 6-3 decision at 174, while Larson's bid for a technical fall just short, as he majored his opponent by a 16-2 score. Missouri closed out the match with two more falls, getting pins by Haynes and Bradley at 197 and heavyweight. Haynes took down his opponent and picked up six points in near falls before recording the pin in 2:26, while a takedown by Bradley and strong work on top led him to sticking his opponent in 1:41.

### MIZZOU PLACES FIFTH AT NATIONAL DUALS

The Missouri Tigers took fifth place at the 2011 NWCA National Duals after posting a 4-1 record at the tournament.

Mizzou opened up with a 27-9 win over host Northern Iowa, as their first three wins all came with bonus points. Alan Waters opened things up with a pin at 125, while Todd Schavrien scored a technical fall at 141 and Kyle Bradley picked up a major decision at 149, pacing the Tigers to a big margin early on.

The Tigers' next match was against No. 1 Cornell, who edged out Mizzou by a slight 18-15 margin. Missouri jumped out to a 9-0 lead after the first three matches, but the strength of the Big Red's middle weight classes pulled them ahead. Brent Haynes and Dom Bradley won at their respective classes, but the bonus points by Cornell at 174 and 184 was enough to give them the match.

Missouri bounced back with an impressive 29-12 victory over No. 17 Central Michigan in the team's first consolation match. After falling behind 6-3 after the first two matches, Schavrien scored a fall at 141 to put the Tigers up 9-6, a lead they would extend to 19-6 over the next three matches. Back-to-back technical falls by Mike Larson at 184 and Haynes at 197 put the match out of reach for the

Chippewas, and guaranteeing the Tigers their first top-eight finish since 2007.

On day two, the Tigers opened up with a 21-12 upset of No. 6 Boise State. Schavrien scored another victory by bonus points to give them an early 7-3 lead. Kyle Bradley and Nick Gregoris battled hard at 149 and 157 with Boise State's grapplers, who are ranked No. 3 and No. 2 in those classes respectively, holding them to wins by decision to keep the Tigers within striking distance. The Broncos led 12-10 heading into the 184 pound match, but the Tigers took the last three matches to claim the dual. Dorian Henderson started things off by wrestling up to 184 and scoring a 19-5 major decision to put Mizzou ahead by a pair. A decision by Haynes put Mizzou up five, leaving Boise State needing a fall at heavyweight over No. 6 Dom Bradley to take the meet. Instead, Bradley picked up a 13-3 major decision, sending the Tigers to the fifth place match.

Paired up against conference rival Oklahoma State, the Tigers pulled off their second straight upset over a top-six team, beating the No. 2 Cowboys by a 21-19 final to claim fifth. Down 12-3, Gregoris pulled off the upset of the weekend for Mizzou, pinning No. 14 Neil Erisman in 2:35 to cut the lead to 12-9. Zach Toal scored a tough decision over No. 16 Dallas Bailey, and a win by default for Dorian Henderson put the Tigers up six. Oklahoma State picked up seven points over the next two matches to take a one point lead into the final match, by Bradley finished off his perfect 4-0 weekend with a 6-1 decision to clinch it for Missouri.

### **TIGERS WIN MIDLANDS TEAM TITLE**

For the first time in program history, the Missouri wrestling team has won the Midlands Championships team title, as the Tigers finished the tournament with 103.5 points to beat out Wisconsin (95.5), Lehigh (93.0) and Iowa (91.0). Missouri wins the Midlands title after finishing third in 2008 and fourth in 2009.

The Tigers entered the day in sixth place but had more wrestlers remaining than any other team in the tournament with eight. Going into the championship session tonight, Missouri had moved up to first place, holding a 13 point edge over second place Wisconsin with five grapplers still alive in the wrestlebacks.

Mizzou ended up placing six wrestlers overall, with freshman Alan Waters leading the way with a third place finish at 125 pounds. Redshirt freshman Zach Toal (165), sophomore Mike Larson (184) and sophomore Brent Haynes (197) each finished fourth. Senior Todd Schavrien took fifth at 141, while junior Patrick Wright took eighth at 174.

### **WRESTLING FINALIZES 2011-12 CLASS**

The University of Missouri wrestling program added three student-athletes to next year's roster, as Trevor Jauch (Crystal Lake, Ill.), Cody Johnston (Warrensburg, Mo.) and Brandon Rice (Washington, Ill.) have signed national letters of intent to continue their wrestling careers at Mizzou.

Jauch, the 87th ranked high school wrestler overall according to InterMat, has put together a three-year record of 120-9 for Crystal Lake Central for coaches Justin Lehr and Jon Murphy. Wrestling at 135 pounds, Jauch ranks seventh nationally in the weight class according to W.I.N. Magazine and ninth according to InterMat. Last season, Jauch won the Illinois state title at 125 pounds to follow up his 2009 state title at 112 pounds.

A three-time state qualifier in Missouri, Johnston is currently 128-15 in his career for Warrensburg High School. Wrestling at 135 pounds his freshman year, Johnston posted a 28-10 record while qualifying for state and earned National High School Coaches Association (NHSCA) All-America honors. At 145 pounds his sophomore year, Johnston was district champion and won 38 of his 41 matches. Last season, Johnston finished third at state and won his second straight district title while posting a record of 46-2. He was an NHSCA Junior Nationals All-American, a Fargo Junior Nationals Greco All-American and finished second at the Super 32 tournament.

Rice was a 2010 Illinois Greco state champion and has a career record of 107-21 through his first three years. A three-year team captain for Washington Community High School, Rice is a two-time Illinois High School Association state qualifier, a two-time regional champion and a two-time conference champion. He was selected to the 2010 Junior Greco Duals All-Tournament Team and a 2009 Fargo Junior Greco All-American.

## SCHAVRIEN NAMED WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

Missouri senior 141 pounder Todd Schavrien was named Big 12 Wrestler of the Week, as announced by the league office on Monday, Dec. 20. It is the first weekly honor for the Poway, Calif., native and the first for the Tigers since the 2008-09 season.

Schavrien helped the Tigers to a 2-0 day at the Indiana Duals on Sunday with a pair of bonus point victories, as he defeated Eastern Michigan's Mike Leholm by a 17-0 score and pinned Indiana's Mitchell Rinsey in 4:50.

Schavrien recorded his technical fall win in the first period, as he made quick work of Leholm. He scored a quick takedown early in the match, and rolled Leholm over five times for three-point near falls, scoring the win with 10 seconds left in the first period. Against Rinsey, Schavrien went up 3-0 with a first period takedown and a second period escape. Late in the second, Rinsey attempted a cradle on Schavrien, but he was able to keep Rinsey on his back and record the pin with 10 seconds remaining in the second.

## TIGERS EDGED OUT BY PURDUE

The No. 16 Missouri Tigers (6-4) saw their three match winning streak come to an end on Sunday, as they fell to No. 21 Purdue (3-0-1) by a score of 18-15. Missouri held a 12-7 lead after six matches, but the Boilermakers picked up 11 points over the next three matches to take control.

Missouri jumped out to an early 3-0 lead on freshman Alan Waters' 20th win of the season. Waters knocked off No. 30 Camden Eppert by a 6-0 decision, keeping his perfect record intact. The freshman got out to a 3-0 lead after the first period, getting a point when his opponent was called for an illegal lock before scoring a takedown. Waters started down in the second and reversed Eppert, and rode him out in the third for the riding time point.

The Tigers took wins at 141, 149 and 165, however, Purdue was able to take control of the match, getting three straight wins at 174-184-197, including two by bonus points. After a 2-1 decision by Luke Manuel over Dorian Henderson at 174, Purdue's A.J. Kissel, ranked 10th, scored a major at 184, as did No. 7 Logan Brown at 197, to take an 18-12 lead.

Heavyweight Dom Bradley won his 11th match of the year, winning by a 7-3 decision over Roger Vukobratovich, but Purdue would hold on to take the dual, 18-15.

## MIZZOU OUTLASTS KENT STATE, 19-15

The No. 16 Missouri Tigers wrestling team (6-3) pulled out a big 19-15 victory over the Kent State Golden Flashes on Sunday afternoon at the Hearnes Center. The Tigers were able to win four of the last five matches on the day to secure the win, the team's third in a row.

Freshman Alan Waters knocked off No. 5 Nic Bedelyon by a 3-1 decision to open the day at 125 pounds. From there, the Tigers got a major decision by 141 pounder Todd Schavrien, and three straight decision from Zach Toal at 165, Dorian Henderson at 174 and Mike Larson at 184. With a one-point lead going into the final match, Mizzou's Dom Bradley, ranked No. 5 in the country, edged out No. 12 Brendan Barlow in overtime.

After a slow first period, Bradley started down in the second and immediately escaped. He then took Barlow down 20 seconds later, though Barlow would work an escape before the period ended as Bradley led 3-1 heading to the third. Barlow escaped to start the third, cutting the lead to 3-2. With under 10 seconds left in the match, Barlow took shot in on a single on Bradley, and as Bradley attempted to escape the hold, he ran out of bounds and was hit for a fleeing-the-mat penalty with just seconds left, tying the match and sending it to sudden death overtime. Bradley kept his composure, though, and scored a takedown just as overtime was about to end, giving him the 5-3 win and securing the 19-15 victory for Mizzou.

## SEVEN TIGERS PLACE AT UNI OPEN

The Missouri wrestling team sent nine Tigers to the UNI Open this past weekend in Cedar Falls, Iowa, and seven returned with medals after placing in the top six. Sophomore Brent Haynes captured his third tournament championship of the year at 197 pounds, while sophomore Todd

Also placing for Mizzou was Tyler Perry, who placed fourth at heavyweight, Phillip Perry, who took fourth at 165, Nicholas Hucke, finishing fifth at 149 and Weston Keleher, taking sixth at 184.

### **TIGERS WIN THREE AT NORTHEAST DUALS**

The 16th ranked Mizzou wrestling team (5-3) picked up three wins in four matches at the Journeymen/ASICS Northeast Duals, held in Albany, N.Y. on Saturday. Missouri knocked off American by a 23-15 to open the day, and after a loss to No. 24 Rutgers by a 19-16 score, bounced back to defeat No. 11 Lehigh, 21-10, and Maryland, 18-12. Freshman Alan Waters (125), sophomore Nathan McCormick (133) and senior Todd Schavrien (141) combined to go 12-0 in their matches, helping the Tigers jump out to early leads in each of the duals.

### **MIZZOU TAKES TWO AT QUAD MEET**

The No. 11 Missouri wrestling team opened the home portion of their 2010-11 dual schedule with a quad meet that featured Lindenwood, Hofstra and No. 17 Oregon State. The Tigers finished the day with a 2-1 record, knocking off their first two opponents before dropping their last dual.

Missouri's day got started with their in-state foe, Lindenwood, who ranks as high as No. 8 in the NAIA rankings. The Tigers took care of business, winning 41-0 for the program's first shutout since Mizzou shutout Maryland by a 47-0 score in 2004-05.

The Tigers then took on the Hofstra Pride, who is receiving votes in the latest NWCA/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Tigers got several big wins late in the match, winning at 184, 197 and heavyweight to pull out the 19-15 victory.

The last dual of the day pitted the Tigers up against No. 17 Oregon State. The Beavers jumped out big early, winning four of the first six matches and picked up some big wins late to hold off the surging Tigers, as OSU won 19-13.

### **HAYNES, MELLON WIN AT OPEN**

The Missouri wrestling team sent 23 wrestlers to the 2010 Kaufman/Brand Open in Omaha, Neb., on Saturday, and six Tigers returned to Columbia with hardware. Sophomore Brent Haynes and freshman Devin Mellon led the charge, with each claiming first place in their respective classes. Weston Keleher placed second at the 184 elite, Drake Houdashelt took third in 157 amateur, and Johnny Eblen (184 amateur) and Clarence Neely (184 elite) each took sixth.

Haynes swept through the 197 pound elite bracket in dominating fashion, pinning four of his five opponents while scoring a technical fall on the other. His fastest pin came in 1:41, and his 15-0 tech. fall win came in 2:51. In the finals, Haynes pinned Minnesota's Joe Nord in just 2:05.

In the heavyweight amateur bracket, Mellon rallied off four decisions in five matches to claim the title. He opened with wins of 7-3 and 7-4, and after getting credit for a fall due to disqualification, he then beat Kyle Slifka of Iowa State by a 5-3 score before winning the championship by a 3-1 score in sudden victory overtime.

### **TIGERS TAKE ALL 10 TITLES AT CMU OPEN**

The Missouri wrestling team put on an unbelievable show at the annual University of Central Missouri Open, as Mizzou grapplers claimed first place in all 10 weight classes during the all-day event. In total, 21 Tigers earned medals.

Alan Waters (125), Nathan McCormick (133), Cody Farinella (141), Brandon Wiest (149), Drake Houdashelt (157), Nick Gregoris (165), Dorian Henderson (174), Mike Larson (184), Brent Haynes (197) and Dom Bradley (HWT) each took first place in their respective weight classes.

True freshman Alan Waters picked up where he left off last weekend at Lindenwood, as he opened the meet with an 8-3 decision over Logan Arlis to improve his record to 6-0 on the season.

Zach Toal, a redshirt freshman, pulled the Tigers within six with a 10-4 decision over Conrad Polz. Toal scored takedowns in each of the first two periods before going off in the third, as he picked up another pair of takedowns and an escape to go along with his riding time point.

Junior Dorian Henderson secured the only bonus points of the evening, as he took down Tony Dallago four times to go with a nearfall as he coasted to a 13-5 victory.

Fellow junior Dom Bradley closed out the evening with a 3-0 victory over Patrick Walker. After a scoreless first, Bradley escaped in the second after choosing down, and took Walker down 47 seconds into the third period.

### **THREE TAKE TITLES AT LINDENWOOD**

While several Tigers were competing at the annual Black and Gold wrestle-off's on Oct. 30, the rest of the team was getting their first taste of action this season at the Lindenwood Open. Three Mizzou grapplers, freshman Alan Waters, junior Danny Gonsor and sophomore Nick Gregoris took first place in their class, while nine Tigers in all secured medals on the day.

Waters entered the 125 pound class as the No. 2 seed, and coasted through the first two rounds with back-to-back pins, putting Paul Myers (UN-SIUE) on his back in 1:33 and defeating Ben Seglin (WC) in 1:12. After a 4-1 decision and a 6-0 decision to advance to the finals, Waters pinned No. 4 seed Paulie Hansen (MVC) in 1:00 to take the crown.

At 157 pounds, Gonsor was the top-ranked seed in his class and lived up to the hype, as he dominated his five matches on his way to the title. Gonsor, a transfer from the University of Virginia, pinned his first three opponents, taking out Kyle Dooley (UN-ILL) in 4:14, Josh Ballard (MCK) in 1:52 and Josh Mccoy (MMI) in 0:53 to advance to the semifinals. From there, he picked up a 15-0 technical fall victory over No. 4 seed Jake Johnson (LU) to move on to the championship, where he dropped No. 2 seed Jackson Morse (UN-ILL) by a 17-0 score for his second straight technical fall victory, earning him the title.

Nick Gregoris, who entered the tournament unseeded at 165 pounds, took first place with an impressive showing. After pinning his first opponent, Zack Long (MVC) in 1:11, Gregoris then knocked off No. 1 seed Ryan Moyer (UN-LU) by a 5-2 score. From there, he picked up a 12-1 major decision over No. 8 Parker Madl (UN-OU), and defeated No. 4 seed Drae Cox (LU), 7-1, to move on to the finals. Gregoris was crowned champion after pinning fellow Tiger, freshman Phillip Perry, in 1:01.

### **TIGERS RETURN THREE NCAA QUALIFIERS**

The 2010-11 Missouri wrestling team will return three of their six NCAA qualifiers from last season. Senior Todd Schavrien, junior Dorian Henderson and sophomore Brent Haynes each qualified for nationals last year.

Schavrien made his second straight NCAA appearance last year, qualifying at 141 pounds. After dropping his opening match against No. 1 seeded Kyle Dake, Schavrien bounced back with two straight wins before being eliminated by the No. 3 seed from Minnesota, Michael Thorn.

Henderson moved down to 174 pounds last year and earned his second straight bid to nationals, where he went 2-2 with a 3-2 win over Bucknell's Shane Riccio and an 11-3 major decision over conference opponent Ryan Burk from Iowa State.

Haynes qualified for nationals as a redshirt freshman at 197 pounds, and put together three victories before being eliminated. He opened up with an 18-6 major decision over Eric Schuth from Ohio, and bounced back from a tough loss with an 8-2 win over Richard Starks of Army and an 11-0 major decision over Ohio State's Cody Magrum.

### NEW FACES

Of the 41 grapplers on the 2010-11 Missouri wrestling squad, 16 are new to the Tiger program this season. The 2010-11 class was ranked as the 11th-best incoming class by InterMat, with freshmen Alan Waters, Drake Houdashelt and Simon Kitzis rankings in the top 100 individually. The 13 freshmen are joined by three transfers - junior Danny Gonsor (Virginia), sophomore Mike Larson (Cal State University Bakersfield) and sophomore Clarence Neely (Meramec). Both Gonsor and Larson qualified for the NCAA Championships last season.

### BACK-TO-BACK ALL-AMERICANS

In Missouri wrestling's 64 years, nine Tigers have earned back-to-back All-America honors. Thirty Tigers have collected 46 honors with 13 earning two or more accolades, but only Dave Young (1981-82), Shaon Fry (1993-94), Scott Barker (2002-03), Ben Askren (2004-07), Tyler McCormick (2006-07), Nicholas Marable (2008-09), Maxwell Askren (2008-10), Raymond Jordan (2008-09) and Mark Ellis (2009-10) managed top eight finishes in consecutive years.
