FIRST SHOT

The Indiana University wrestling team (10-5) wraps up the 2011 home schedule this Friday (Feb. 11), playing host to the Michigan State Spartans (9-5) at 7 pm on the national stage as the match will be broadcast on the Big Ten Network; tape-delayed on Feb. 12 at 2 pm. Tim Johnson (play-by-play) and Lee Kemp (color commentary) are set to call all the action.

Four Hoosiers are ranked nationally while Michigan State is expected to send a pair of nationally-ranked wrestlers onto the mat. Both ranked Spartans will face off with ranked Hoosiers as the 149-pound bout pits #13 Kurt Kinser vs. #20 Dan Osterman; and at heavyweight, #9 Ricky Alcalá will enter the circle opposite of #20 Joe Rizqallah.

2010-11 (SENIOR): Placed third at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational ... took second at the Michigan State Open ... defeated #11 Brian Stephens (Virginia Tech) twice at the CKLV Invite ... also topped #12 Ivan Lopouchanski (UNCG) out in Vegas ... swept the Disney Duals, IU Duals and IU Quad.

2009-10 (JUNIOR): Advanced to the NCAA Championships for the third time in as many seasons ... was ranked as high as No. 6 nationally and finished the regular season slotted eighth at 157 pounds ... posted an overall record of 29-9, including a 6-2 mark in the Big Ten ... compiled eight pins and four major decisions ... reached the finals of three non-conference tournaments, winning the title at the Michigan State Open with a 4-0 day ... took runner-up in the Eastern Michigan Open and Southern Scuffle ... defeated No. 3 Matt Moley of Bloomsburg, 3-1, to advance to the championship match at the Scuffle ... won three consecutive matches in the NCAA Championships ... took fifth place at the Big Ten Championships ... pinned three straight opponents during a midseason five-bout winning streak ... also strung together 11 consecutive victories earlier in the season.

2008-09 (SOPHOMORE): Qualified for the NCAA Championships for the second consecutive year after placing sixth at Big Tens ... moved up to the 157-lbs. weight class and posted a 19-10 record overall, 5-3 in the Big Ten ... finished the regular season ranked 15th nationally, ranking as high as ninth earlier in the year ... compiled five pins, a tech fall and two major decisions throughout the season ... tallied four wins over nationally-ranked opponents on the year ... earned Big Ten Wrestler of the Week laurels after beginning his season with a 5-0 weekend and individual title at the Michigan State Open ... defeated #8 Matt Moley (Bloomsburg) in the second overtime en route to his MSU Open crown ... followed that up by going 5-2 at the Las Vegas Open for a seventh place finish that included wins over #17 Matt Dragon of Penn and #13 Jason Johnstone from Ohio State ... also topped Northwestern's Jason Welch twice, once when he was unranked early in the season and again during the dual match when Welch was slotted #14 in the national rankings ... picked up a win at NCAAs, eliminating Jess Dong of Virginia Tech from the competition with a 10-2 major decision.

2007-08 (FRESHMAN): Qualified for the NCAA Championships, earning one of the Big Ten's two wild card selections after placing eighth at the Big Ten Championships ... ended the season at 32-16 overall, 12-6 in duals, with 18 pins, a tech fall and a major decision ... his 18 falls finished in the national top-five rankings and are the second highest single-season total in IU history, just one pin shy of the all-time school record held by Rod Chamberlin (1981) ... had his hand raised three times at the NCAAs, including after a first-period pin of #19 Don Fisch (Rider) in the first round ... defeated three-time All-American and former NCAA finalist, Ryan Lang of Northwestern, in a 6-4 sudden victory at the Big Tens ... during a 13-match winning streak midseason, he stuck 12 of his adversaries in that stretch ... began collegiate career with a fifth-place showing at the Michigan State Open ... took third place at the Missouri Open by going 7-1, winning six matches via pin ... went a combined 7-0 (all pins) at the Hoosier Duals, F.I.T.E. Duals and National Duals ... stuck #17 Josh Wagner of Missouri in the first period, 2:46, at the National Duals ... ripped off four victories at the Midlands ... had a 3-0 showing at the Hoosier Quad that included a pin, tech fall and major decision.

2006-07 (REDSHIRT): Went 15-4 overall with six pin falls and two major decisions ... won the Missouri Open Championship at the 149-pound weight class by defeating the No. 1 seed with a 2-1 decision in the finals ... finished in third place at the Nittany Lion Open with a 5-1 record that included three pin falls and two major decisions.

Michigan State leads the all-time series 44-21-3, but the Hoosiers have dominated as of late with four consecutive victories; a winning streak that dates back to 2005.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN

Michigan State assistant coach Roger Chandler was a 1997 Big Ten Champion under IU Head Coach Duane Goldman. Chandler ranks third all-time in IU lore with 40 pins and 10th at 38 wins.

BIG BOYS DOING BIG THINGS

Indiana's two heaviest wrestlers, 197-pounder Matt Powless and HWT Ricky Alcalá are each red-hot lately. Powless' team-high 30th win of the season came against #11 Anthony Biondo (Michigan). Alcalá also posted a big-time victory over the Wolverines, topping #8 Ben Aplan for his second triumph over a top-10 foe in as many weeks.

NUMBERS DON'T LIE

Matt Powless leads all of Division-I wrestling with 12 major decisions and ranks 12th nationally with 30 victories overall (second-most in the Big Ten). Kurt Kinser can also be found in the national statistical rankings, tied for 33rd with his nine pins (T-11th in the Big Ten).

AMONGST NATION'S ELITE

Four of Indiana's 10 regular starters are ranked in the latest Intermat national rankings. Five different IU grapplers have cracked the top-20 at some point this season. Those currently ranked are:

Paul Young - #8 at 157 lbs.
Matt Powless- #9 at 197 lbs.
Ricky Alcalá- #9 at 285 lbs.
Kurt Kinser- #13 at 149 lbs.

CRACKING THE CENTURY MARK

Kinser and Young are also racking up wins at an impressive pace. Kinser tallied win number 100 of his career by defeating Minnesota's Danny Zilverberg on Jan. 14. He is just the 15th Hoosier in school history to crack the century mark. Meanwhile, Young has had his hand raised 98 times. The redshirt seniors need to reach 112 victories to crack IU's all-time top-10.

FLAT TO THE MAT

High school classmates Kurt Kinser and Paul Young each rank in the top-10 for most career pins in school history.

Kinser is sticking opponents at record-breaking pace, already ranking third all-time with 40 pins and just eight falls shy of surpassing Viktor Sveda (1998-2002) for the top slot. Young owns 31 career pins, pulling him even with former teammate Trevor Perry (2007-10) for eighth place all-time.

YOUNG SHINES AT THE SCUFFLE

Paul Young made a run to the 157-pound championship match at the Southern Scuffle, defeating five adversaries in the process. His most impressive victory came in the semifinals when he avenged an earlier season loss, this time beating out seventh-ranked Bryce Saddoris of the Naval Academy. Young finished off a

single-leg trip late in the second period for a takedown to grab the 4-2 lead. He then rode out Saddoris for the entire third frame, erasing his riding time deficit and securing his spot in the finals.

VIVA LAS VEGAS

Kurt Kinser and Matt Powless each garnered third-place finishes at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational. Kinser defeated three nationally-ranked wrestlers while Powless had to down a pair of ranked grapplers to earn third place.

FAST START AT THE MSU OPEN

Indiana Wrestling began the 2010-11 season at the Michigan State Open. Head Coach Duane Goldman saw nine of his wrestlers place in the tournament, including 197-lbs. champion Matt Powless and four additional finalists.
