Cyclone Notebook

- Iowa State is led by 165-pounder senior Andrew Sorenson who has the most victories on the team this season. The fourth-ranked Sorenson remains undefeated in dual competition and moves one match closer to securing 90 career wins. The Woden, Iowa native currently has 87 career victories on his Cyclone resume.
- Heavyweight Matt Gibson recently eclipsed his 20th win and enters competition following a major decision against Cornell's Maciej Jochym.
- The Cyclones are 2-12 in dual competition and 0-6 in Big 12 Conference play.

Head Coach Kevin Jackson



Former Olympic gold medalist and two-time World Champion Kevin Jackson was named Iowa State's head wrestling coach on May 1, 2009

In his first year at the helm, Jackson led the Cyclones to a 13-2 dual meet record and a third-place finish at the 2010 NCAA Championships. He coached Jake Varner and David Zabriskie to individual national championships. In his second year he coached Jon Reader to an individual national championship.

Jackson captured gold medals at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain and at the World Championships in both 1991 (Varna, Bulgaria) and 1995 (Atlanta). He is one of just five wrestlers in U.S. history with three career world-level titles. Jackson is a member of the FILA International Wrestling Hall of Fame, the United States National Wrestling Hall of Fame (as a distinguished member) and the Iowa State University Athletics Hall of Fame (2007 inductee).

Jackson served eight years (2001-08) as the National Freestyle Coach for USA Wrestling. His 2001 freestyle team won the World Cup, the 2003 team placed second and the 2006 squad finished third at that meet.

As a college wrestler, he attended Louisiana State and earned All-America honors three times before the school dropped the sport. He transferred to Iowa State for his senior year and captained the Cyclones' last NCAA championship team (1987), earning another All-America award with a NCAA runner-up finish and registering a 30-3-1 record.

After college, Jackson won two Pan American Games titles and was a member of World Championship teams for the United States in both 1993 and 1995. He won three U.S. National Titles and placed second five times. Jackson also became the first American to win the prestigious Takhti Cup (1998) in Tehran, Iran.

Jackson's success earned him a number of major awards, including the 1995 John Smith Award as National Freestyle Wrestler of the Year, 1992 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year and 1991 USA Wrestling and USOC Wrestler of the Year.

Iowa State vs. Northern Iowa Notes

- Iowa State leads the all-time series against Northern Iowa 53-16.
- Last season the in-state rivals met in Hilton Coliseum where the Cyclones prevailed 21-20.

Scouting the University of Northern Iowa

- The Panthers are 5-4 overall and 3-1 in Western Wrestling Conference play.
- Ranked 11th nationally at 133 pounds, Joe Colon is this week's Western Wrestling Conference Wrestler of the Week. Colon is 3-1 against ranked opponents this season and remains undefeated in dual competition.
- Northern Iowa enters the contest after a 27-12 loss to No. 12 Wyoming on the road.

Emotional Senior Day Victory

- Cyclone captain Andrew Sorenson was the only senior to compete on Senior Day Sunday in Hilton Coliseum against No. 4 Cornell. Sorenson was determined to end his final home dual in front of a home crowd on a high note, and he did just that.
- Entering the final period, Sorenson led 6-1 against Cornell's Marshall Peppelman. Determined to score bonus points, Sorenson posted six takedowns in the final two minutes of the match en route to a 21-6 four-point technical fall.
- Sorenson leads the team in technical falls and pins, with five apiece.

Moreno Upsets in Norman

- Following his second dual victory of the season against Virginia Tech Jan. 13, redshirt freshman Michael Moreno posted a 3-2 decision over No. 14 Matt Lester of Oklahoma Jan. 20.

Goettl On a Roll, Stuns No. 1 Seed

- Luke Goettl earned his most impressive victory Jan. 20 in an upset of No. 1 Kendrick Maple in an 11-9 overtime victory to hand the Sooner his first loss of the season.
- Goettl has garnered wins over ranked foes in No. 2 Zack Kemmerer (Penn), No. 10 Billy Ashnault (Rutgers), No. 11 Zach Neibert (VT) and No. 1 Kendrick Maple.
- Goettl claimed a sixth-place finish at the 2011 Ken Kraft Midlands Championships Dec. 29 & 30. The 141-pounder was the only unseeded

- The Clarkdale, Ariz., native returned to his home state following Midlands and pinned Arizona State's Nathan Hoffer at 4:57. In the Cyclones' return to Ames, Goettl topped another Tiger grappler in junior Nicholas Hucke on Sunday.

Five Cyclones Place at 2011 Midlands Championships

- Heavyweight Matt Gibson was the highest place finisher for the Cyclones at Midlands. After losing his first match of the tournament, the Vallejo, Calif., native responded by winning seven straight matches en route to a third place title.
- Both Andrew Sorenson (165) and Tanner Weatherman (174) captured fifth place titles in the tournament. Weatherman wrestled unattached for the Cyclones at the tournament.
- Goettl finished sixth and 174-pounder Mikey England earned an eighth place title.

Spangler Tops Two Ranked Opponents

- Redshirt junior Chris Spangler had back-to-back wins over ranked opponents in the Cyclones' duals against No. 1 Iowa and No. 4 Minnesota. Spangler upset Hawkeye grappler Ethen Lofthouse, ranked sixth at the time, in an 8-5 decision. Iowa State then traveled to Minneapolis, where the 174-pounder topped No. 10 Logan Storley.

Upper-Weights Shine Against Sooners

- Iowa State won four of the five upper-weight matches against the Sooners Nov. 27. Sorenson started off the second round of matches with an 11-1 major decision over Bubby Graham. Spangler followed by edging past Sooner grappler Chase Nelson in a physical 12-11 decision. Beard continued the Cyclone momentum with a 7-4 decision over redshirt junior Erich Schmidtke in which he posted three takedowns and one escape.

Finch Tops Rupp in Big 12 Opener

- At 125 pounds, Finch upset Oklahoma State's Ladd Rupp, ranked eighth nationally, in a 6-4 decision Nov. 25. Finch led 5-4 after three periods and tacked on an extra point for riding time.

Five Cyclones Crowned in Harold Nichols Open

- Sorenson continued his domination on the season at the annual Harold Nichols Cyclone Open with two pins on his way to the 165-pound title.
- Redshirt freshman Ryak Finch became the 125-pound champion in commanding fashion. Finch won

his first match of the day on a 17-0 technical fall in the first period and pinned his final two opponents on the day.

- Freshman 133-pounder Shayden Terukina wrestled unattached and impressed a number of Cyclone fans in Hilton Coliseum. Terukina won the title after two technical falls and a pin at 4:27 in the semifinals. It was his comeback victory that showed determination as the Hawaiian trailed 7-1 at one point and came out on top with a 9-7 decision.
- After coach Jackson bumped him up to 197 pounds a week before the open, redshirt sophomore Cole Shafer did more than hold his ground in the new weight class. Shafer pinned his championship opponent a mere 32 seconds into the match.
- The final Cyclone champion of the day was redshirt junior Matt Gibson, who wrestled unattached for Iowa State and won the 285-pound title. The Vallejo, Calif., native pinned two of his four opponents and finished the day with a 5-0 decision over Jake Kahnke of St. Cloud State.

Senior Sorenson Continues Cyclone Tradition

- After suffering a season-ending elbow injury prior to the Big 12 Championships last year, senior Andrew Sorenson has started off the 2011-12 season strong. The Woden, Iowa native won his first match with a pin and his second in a 5-2 decision over Boston's Kyle Czarnecki. Sorenson ended the 2010-11 season with a 16-4 record and defeated three top-ten ranked opponents.
- As the only senior in the Cyclones' current lineup, Sorenson leads by example both on and off the mat. Sorenson was chosen as the Cyclone captain this season and has demonstrated the meaning of Iowa State wrestling by leading the team in victories this season.

England Upsets in Boston

- Redshirt freshman Mikey England stunned No. 5 Hunter Meys of Boston University at the Nor'Easter Duals Nov. 6. England trailed 3-1 heading into the final period and battled back with an escape and takedown to win in a 4-3 decision.

Youngsters Impress at Kaye Young Open

- Four Cyclones claimed titles at the annual Kaye Young Open in Mason City, Iowa Nov. 5. Three of the four were underclassmen. Redshirt freshmen Joe Cozart and Quinn Wilson earned first place finishes, along with freshman Logan Molina. Cozart went 4-0 in Mason City in the 149 division, while Wilson finished undefeated at 174 and Molina won all four at 165.

Atypical Heavyweight

- Matt Gibson began his 2011-12 season with a heavyweight title at the Kaye Young Open. At 6-foot-6-inches, Gibson is an atypical and dangerous wrestler at 285 pounds and won two of his four matches at Kaye Young with pins.
- As of Jan. 30, 2012 Gibson was the team-leader in pins on the season with a total of seven. The Vallejo, Calif., native has posted bonus points in 11 of his 27 matches and recently eclipsed his 20th victory.

Paulson Joins Staff, Reader to Volunteer

- World-class athlete Travis Paulson is making the transition from wrestler to coach. Paulson will balance his new coaching duties at Iowa State with training for the 2012 Olympic Games in London. The three-time All-American and his brother Trent Paulson each received automatic bids into the 2012 men's freestyle U.S. Olympic Team in early October.
- Three-time All-American Jon Reader will return to Ames this season as a volunteer assistant coach. Reader finished out his Cyclone career last year on top, with an NCAA national title at 174 pounds and was named Iowa State's student-athlete of the Year.

A Look Back at 2010-11

- The Cyclones started the year off with two victories over ranked teams. Senior Jon Reader was a Midlands champion at 174 pounds. Jerome Ward was runner-up at Big 12 Championships while Reader was a conference champion. Five of 10 Cyclone wrestlers qualified for spots at the NCAA Championships. Reader finished the season undefeated and claimed a national title at 174 pounds.
