My name is Joey Farnsworth and I have competed in the sport of wrestling for the past 10 years. I have won 3 North Carolina AAU state titles and 2 South Carolina AAU state titles. Growing up I competed in many national tournaments and placed in the top 6 almost every time. I also attained 4 AAU national championships and 1 NHSCA Elementary National Championship (3-4 Grade Div) as a member of the Hope Mills Pythons Wrestling Club.

I did not compete in wrestling for my first 2 years of high school as I was too light for the 103 lb. class. Once given the size and opportunity I made the most of it by placing 3rd in the regionals and 3rd in States. With the guidance of my high school coaches I continued to improve throughout the spring as witnessed by my NHSCA Junior National Championship won in Pittsburgh, PA in late March.

During the summer I placed first in the North Carolina State Games and attended wrestling camp at Appalachian State University where I went undefeated in 15 bouts. This fall I competed in the super 32 and placed 3rd getting the opportunity to wrestle several national freestyle and Greco place winners. More recently, I was featured in *Sports Illustrated's* "Faces in the Crowd"

for having gone 43 matches without giving up a point. The only point surrendered was for an illegal figure four to the head. I have since continued a new streak as I am currently 59-0 and unscored upon since that 43rd match.

February 10th I was proud to be a part of Cary High School's State Duals Championship which we followed this past weekend with our 15th consecutive Regional Championship. I'm looking forward to competing with my teammates in the State Individual Championships this coming weekend. Both our team and I are currently ranked #1 in North Carolina's top division (4A).

I plan on wrestling at a college close to home here in North Carolina. I am hoping to continue my pursuit of studies in the environment and animals. One day I hope to become a biologist studying the environment being a field researcher or becoming a zoologist, one day owning a zoo.

Once I have settled into a career I would like to form my own amateur wrestling team and coach like I was coached when I was younger.

I want to thank my brother (Jimmy) and my parents (AJ and Amy) for their support over these fun years and also my former Python coaches, Chuck Smith, Danny Morneau, and Darrin Halford. I started wrestling competitively when I was 5 years old. My father, Ron, and my brother, Eric, influenced me into the sport. My father has always been my coach, from when I first started through my high school years. I had a lot of success through my elementary years winning over 20 state titles in folkstyle, freestyle, and Greco-Roman.

In 8th grade I broke the varsity line-up and won my first Minnesota State High School Championship. Since then I have won three more state titles and 5 national titles. I spent three years in the sports school, where I had one of the best coaching staffs in Bulgaria. Spending quality time with my coaches on the mat helped me improve my wrestling skills, learn how to train and taught me what wrestling was all about.

My family decided to move to the U.S.A. after winning a green card. The move was very hard, but we got back on our feet. My parents found good jobs and my brother and I continued to wrestle at Fremont High School (Sunnyvale, CA), where we got lucky by ending up with very good coaches – Erik Duus and Bobby Soto. They are both great technicians with two different styles of wrestling. Soto taught me all about folkstyle wrestling, which was completely new to me, and Duus helped me improve my freestyle skills. One of the biggest challenges that I had to face was adapting from freestyle/Greco-Roman wrestling to folkstyle wrestling. My coaches got me through this and many other challenges that I had to face.

My major accomplishments are winning the Ironman and taking the California state championships. I've also been able to maintain my freestyle/Greco skills, winning Junior and Cadet

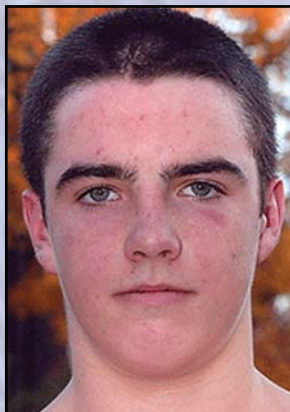

Highlights from folkstyle include two Idaho State titles and many other tournament titles.

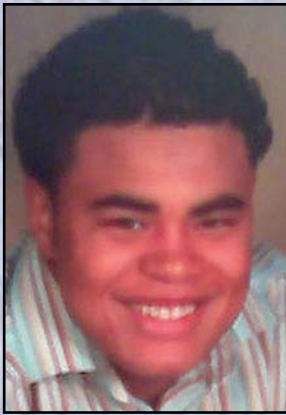

I am and have been the head wrestling coach at Davison High School, in Davison, Michigan for 10 years. I coached the middle school for two years prior. I have been a middle school physical education teacher at Davison for 12 years. I am a proud graduate of Davison High School, where I was a 2 time state champ and 4

time state placer, as well being a Dream Team All-American for 1988.

My wife Jennifer is a Health teacher. She runs the peer counseling

program at the high school. She is like an administrative assistant for the wrestling team. Also being the biggest fan. We have three beautiful children: Chase (8), Haley (7) and Cannon (5).

I earned my bachelors degree from Michigan State University where I was a four-time NCAA Qualifier and Captain of the wrestling team. I wrestled in the 1988 JR World Championships, in Bregenz, Austria, where I placed 7th at 74 kilos. I also placed 4th in 1987 Jr Freestyle Nationals and 2nd 1988 JR Freestyle Nationals. I represented the USA Dream Team for the Oklahoma Classic where I was chosen Outstanding wrestler.

When I arrived to Davison I inherited a program that hadn't had a winning season in eight years or a state champ since I had graduated. The high school team couldn't fill a full lineup. I, however, was up to the challenge. I coached the middle school for two years and established a freestyle and Greco state regional training facility at Davison. I realized we would have to establish a culture and create passion for the sport. I was fortunate to have former two-time state champ and three-time NCAA Qualifier from LSU Kent Elliot. We pushed each other and inspired the attitude and culture of Davison Wrestling today. We won our first team state title in 2000, we were second in 2001 and then won five straight Big School state titles.

During this time we pushed the Junior and Cadet National duals, regionals and National Championships. We established our program as a national force and created an atmosphere that motivated kids and families to move to Davison. I have represented USA Michigan at the last 12 Cadet/Junior Nationals. We have established the Attack Trained Wrestling Camps, where we have brought in numerous national level coaches and wrestlers. We have had access to many University of Michigan wrestlers, Michigan State, and Central Michigan. Mike Kulzcki, Ryan Bertin and Andy Hrovat have been a huge asset. They attended the University of Michigan and St Edwards in Ohio. This has allowed us to establish a nice rivalry with St Edwards. We have wrestled them in 6 duals since 2002 and actually beat them at the Medina Invitational, in 2003.

We have had two wrestlers win the NHSCA National title and two others placed second. Chase Metcalf defeated Darrel Vasquez of California to win the 2002 Title. Paul Donahoe won the 2004 National title and also won two junior freestyle titles as well as placing fourth in the 2003 Jr. Worlds. Paul is nationally ranked at Nebraska.

Brent Metcalf, University of Iowa, was a four-time undefeated state champ as well as a record breaking six-time junior national champion, and he was second in the 2005 NHSCA. Jon Reader, Iowa State University, was second at the NHSCA in 2006 as well as an outstanding wrestler and double Jr National Champion in 2006. Trevor Perry is currently the 174-pounder at Indiana University, he placed 7th at the 2005 NHSCA and was 2nd Jr Greco and 6th Freestyle his senior Year. Kyle Chittick is a freshmen at Cleveland State and was a 3 time Fargo All-American. In addition Keenan Duffie is wrestling 149 and 157 for North Carolina. Jason Whitman is currently wrestling for Central Michigan University and Zak Burns, former Cadet All-American and state champ, is at Princeton. These wrestlers established great expectations for Davison and the rest of Michigan.
