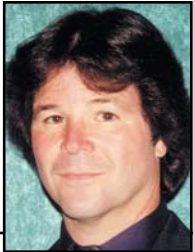


# 2007 College RECRUITING

Here's a look at the top 20 college recruiting classes:

**1. OHIO STATE** – Head Coach Tom Ryan has put together a sensational coaching staff and will look to guide the Scarlet and Gray to their ultimate goal: a national championship. Former Buckeye individual NCAA champions include Tommy Rowlands, Mitch Clark, Rex Holman, Mark Coleman, Jude Skove, Dave Reinbolt, George Bollas, and George Downes. With the signing of a large group of multi-talented incoming freshmen, the proud Ohio State program will look to get to the pinnacle of college wrestling as the nation's number 1 recruiting class comes to Columbus, Ohio. Leading the way are number 1 ranked Colt Sponseller (165) of Ohio, number 2 ranked Nikko Triggas (125) of California, and a pair of number 3 ranked wrestlers in Ohio's Bo Touris (125) and Sean Nemeč (157). Three additional key newcomers are number 9 ranked John Weakley (197) of Ohio, number 16 ranked Jesse Campbell (285) of Ohio, and number 19 ranked Pat Harrington (125) of Ohio.

**2. OKLAHOMA STATE** – Few schools in the country have a history of excellence in any sport as celebrated as the one Oklahoma State University has achieved in wrestling. The list of Cowboy stars is seemingly endless. Names like Kendall Cross, John Smith, Ricky Stewart, Eric Guerrero, Doug Blubaugh, Rex Perry, Earl McCready, Myron Roderick, Pat Smith, Yojiro Uetake, Tadaaki Hatta, Dwayne Keller, Darrell Keller, Mike Sheets, Mark Branch, Chris Barnes, Alan Fried, Johnny Thompson, Lee Roy Smith, Kenny Monday, Johny Hendricks and a multitude of others became legends in Stillwater during their college careers. This year's recruiting class is a very close second to Ohio State University. Highly successful Head Coach John Smith's group is headed by four top-notch student/athletes with great potential. They include number 1 ranked Jamal Parks (141) of Oklahoma, number 1 ranked Clayton Foster (197) of Idaho, number 3 ranked Luke Silver (141) of Texas, and number 4 ranked Luke Ashmore of Texas. Another exceptional newcomer is number 25 ranked Walker Clarke (197) of Oklahoma.

**3. PENN STATE** – In the legacy of wrestling circles across America, the Nittany Lion wrestling program has a long-standing tradition of respect and excellence. Seventeen different wrestlers have won a total of 20 individual NCAA Championship titles. Some of the many great ones include Jeremy Hunter, Glenn Pritzlaff, Kerry McCoy, Sanshiro Abe, John Hughes, Jeff Prescott, Jim Martin, Scott Lynch, Carl DeStefanis, John Fritz, and Andy Matter. recruiting class that will provide some immediate and future fire-power. Leading the way are number 2 ranked Frank Molinaro (141) of New Jersey, number 2 ranked Tim Darling (165) of Pennsylvania, number 3 ranked Jared Platt (197) of New Jersey, and number 4 ranked Cameron Wade (285) of Ohio. Four other new recruits are number 5 ranked Desmond Moore (125) of Pennsylvania, number 23 ranked Colby Pisani (141) of Pennsylvania, number 24 ranked Micah Bollinger (157) of Pennsylvania, and number 26 Chad Mitchell (125) of Georgia.

**4. VIRGINIA TECH** – Head Coach Kevin Dresser and Associate Head Coach Tony Robie combined their efforts and received commitments from 12 exciting student/athletes. The class, which features number 1 ranked Cody Gardner of nearby Christiansburg, Virginia, will ensure the Hokies success at the Division I level as one of the fastest-rising wrestling programs in the country. Other highly-credentialed newcomers include number 2 ranked Chris Diaz (141) of Delaware, number 6 ranked Matt Cusick (149) of Illinois, number 6 ranked D.J. Bruce (197) of Illinois, number 8 ranked Anthony Trongone (174) of New Jersey, number 9 ranked Nick Murray of New Jersey, number 12 ranked David Marone (197) of Colorado, and number 21 ranked Matt Ryan (165) of Pennsylvania.

**5. MISSOURI** – Head Coach Brian Smith has orchestrated a turnaround and has built the Tiger wrestling program into one of the strongest and most dominant in the country. Under his tutelage, Smith guided since graduated Ben Askren, the school's first-ever national champion, to two consecutive NCAA Championships. With the signing of nine highly-touted incoming freshmen, the future looks extremely bright for the Old Gold & Black. The group is led by number 1 ranked Dom Bradley (285) of Missouri, number 4 ranked Troy Dolan (125) of Pennsylvania, number 6 ranked Max Shanaman (141) of New Jersey, and number 9 ranked Mike Schmitz (174) of Minnesota. Other top-notch newcomers include number 12 ranked Dorian Henderson (174) of Georgia, number 13 ranked K.C. Pescaglia (133) of Missouri, number 17 ranked Trevor Collins (197) of

Missouri, number 18 ranked Brandon Wright (165) of Tennessee, and number 25 ranked Brandon Wiest (157) of Missouri.

**6. MINNESOTA** – Under the guidance of Head Coach J Robinson and former national champion and Head Assistant Coach Marty Morgan, the defending NCAA Team Champions Golden Gophers have become a recruiting powerhouse and one of the elite teams in the nation. NCAA champions developed and mentored by Robinson and Morgan include Tim Hartung, Brock Lesnar, Luke Becker, Jared Lawrence, Damion Hahn, Dustin Schlatter, and Cole Konrad. Highlighting this year's exceptional recruiting class are five highly-decorated incoming freshmen. They are number 1 ranked Zach Sanders (125) of Minnesota, number 2 ranked Sonny Yohn (197) of Colorado, number 7 ranked Cody Marcicki (133) of Michigan, number 9 ranked Austin Enoch (141) of Oregon, and number 12 ranked Joe Murphy (125) of Minnesota.

**7. OKLAHOMA** – The tradition-rich University of Oklahoma wrestling program remains highly regarded across the nation. The list of superstar performers of the past is seemingly infinite. Among others are previous NCAA champions Teyon Ware, Robbie Waller, John Kading, Michael Lightner, Melvin Douglas, Dan Chaid, Mark Schultz, Dave Schultz, Andre Metzger, Rod Kilgore, Shawn Garel, Gary Breece, Mike Grant, Wayne Wells, Greg Ruth, Wayne Baughman, Stan Abel, Wayne Martin, and Danny Hodge. Head Coach Jack Spates continues to bring some of the country's top talent to Norman, Oklahoma. Two number 3 ranked wrestlers head this year's recruiting class. They are John Starzyk (133) of Illinois and Seth Vernon (149) of Oklahoma. Three additional key incoming freshmen are number 5 ranked Joey Fio (125) of Idaho, number 6 ranked Ryan Smith (165) of Oregon, and number 16 ranked Kyle Bergstedt (197) of California. An interesting transfer from the University of Indiana is NCAA qualifier Max Dean (165).

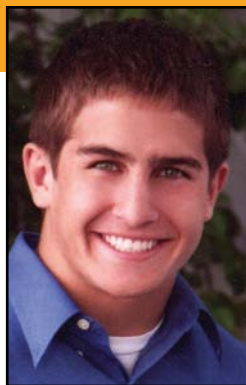
**8. VIRGINIA** — Steve Garland, a former All-American at the University of Virginia, enters his second season as the head coach at

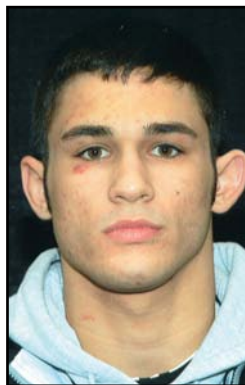

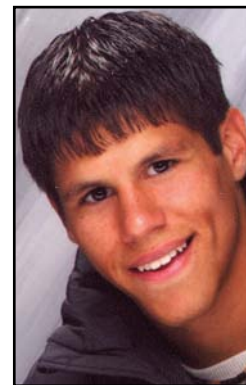

his alma mater. Other previous Cavalier stand-outs include Scott Moore, Jim Harshaw, Tim Foley, Matt Roth, Mike Krafchick, John Matyiko, Derek Capanna, Henry Jordan, Buddy Kerr, Kevin Michaels, and John Parr. Highlighting this year's exceptional recruiting class are number 2 ranked Michael Chaires (165) of New York, number 5 ranked Chris Henrich (174) of Pennsylvania, and number 6 ranked Scott O'Donnell (133) of Missouri. Three additional national caliber performers include number 8 ranked Shawn Harris (149) of Ohio, number 9 ranked Nick Nelson (149) of Pennsylvania, and number 22 ranked Danny Gonsor (157) of Ohio.

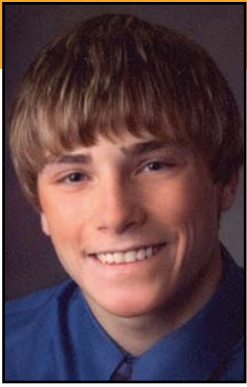
**9. HARVARD** – Two wrestlers have won individual NCAA championships while competing for the Crimson. Jesse Jantzen won the national crown in 2004 while John Harkness was triumphant at the 1938 national tournament. With a stellar group of incoming freshmen owning impressive credentials, Head Coach Jay Weiss hopes to have a few grapplers join the prestigious NCAA champions list. Leading the way are number 1 ranked Corey Jantzen (133) of New York, number 2 ranked Dan Kelly (125) of New Jersey, number 11 ranked Shay Warren (125) of Utah, and number 17 ranked Andy Olsen (197) of Georgia. Another talented newcomer is two-time Massachusetts state champion Craig Carpenter (141).

**10. LEHIGH** – Some of the finest wrestlers to ever take the collegiate mats have proudly competed at Lehigh, including 20 men winning 26 NCAA titles. Among others are national titlists Peter Yozzo, Darryl Burley, Mike Caruso, Mark Lieberman, Mike Lieberman, Tom Sculley, Troy Letters, and Matt Ruppel. Head Coach Greg Strobel continues to bring in quality recruiting classes. This year, five valiant performers will provide a foundation for future greatness. They include number 3 ranked Connor McDonald (125) of Delaware, number 4 ranked Sean Bilodeau (157) of Massachusetts, number 5 ranked Zach Rey (285) of New Jersey, number 7 ranked Kellen Aura (125) of California, and number 14 ranked Brandon Hatchett (165) of Florida.

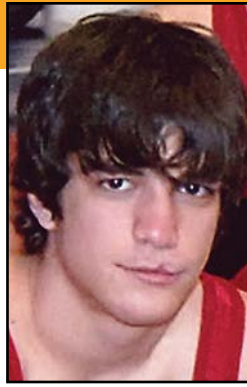
**11. INDIANA** – Nine wrestlers have captured individual NCAA titles for the Hoosiers. They include Joe Dubuque, Brian Dolph, Bob Antonacci, Joe Roman, Chris Traicoff, Charlie McDaniel, Richard Voliva, Pat Devine, and Eddie Belshaw. With a third consecutive top-notch recruiting class, Head Coach Duane Goldman hopes to add several more grapplers to the impressive list of NCAA champions. This year's incoming freshmen are highlighted by number 1 ranked Matt Ortega (125) of New Mexico, number 4 ranked Jeff Pelton (141) of Ohio, and number 10 ranked Joe Fagiano (285) of Illinois. Two others who are both ranked number 25 in their respective weight classes and who both hail from the state of Indiana are Reece Freeman (125) and Matt Powless (174).

**12. MICHIGAN** – A premier force in the collegiate wrestling scene, the University of Michigan boasts a strong tradition of excellence both on and off the mat. Historically, 13 Wolverine grapplers have captured individual NCAA championship titles. They include Ryan Bertin, Kirk Trost, Mark Churella, Jarrett Hubbard, David Porter, Jim Kamman, Jack Barden, Norvard Nalen, William Courtwright, Donald Nichols, Harold Nichols, Carl Dougovito, and Otto Kelly. Head Coach Joe McFarland signed another exceptional recruiting class with loads of potential. Leading the way are number 1 ranked Kellen Russell (133) of New Jersey, number 5 ranked Justin Zeerip (165) of Michigan, number 9 ranked Jason Lara (125) of California, and number 23 ranked Erich Smith (184) of Michigan. Another quality incoming freshmen is Michigan state champion David Johnson (157).

**13. NEBRASKA** – Recognized as one of the nation's finest recruiters, Head Coach Mark Manning consistently attracts top-notch talent to Nebraska's perennially strong wrestling program. Previous national champions for the Huskers include Jason Powell, Brad Vering, Tolly Thompson, Tony Purler, Jason Kelber, Bill Scherr, Jim Scherr, and Mike Nissen. This year's recruiting class is led by number 3 ranked Tucker Lane (285) of Colorado, number 4 ranked Andy Pokorny (125) or Nebraska, and number 5 ranked Chris



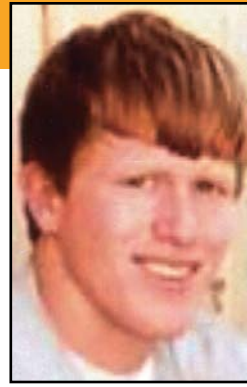

Hacker (149) of Oklahoma. A prolific transfer with the ability to help tremendously is 2007 National Junior College champion Kenny Jordan (133).

**14. NORTHERN IOWA** – The Panthers have a solid, long-standing tradition of producing exceptional wrestlers. Previous greats include memorable names such as Bill Koll, Keith Young, Gerald Leeman, Bill Smith, Bill Nelson, Bill Weick, Tony Davis, Ken Snyder, Jim Miller, Bill Dotson, Kirk Myers, and Gary Bentrin. Head Coach Brad Penrith is a renowned, highly-successful recruiter who consistently brings in top-notch talent from all across the country. Leading the way this year are number 2 ranked Jamal Lawrence (157) of Indiana, number 6 ranked Cruse Aarhus (125) of Iowa, number 7 ranked Patrick Mahon (197) of Minnesota, number 9 ranked Christian Brantley (285) of Illinois, and number 11 ranked Trent Washington (141) of Nebraska. An exciting transfer is National Junior College runner-up Josh Baldrige (133).

**15. KENT STATE** – Head Coach Jim Andrassy and Assistant Coach Josh Moore combined their efforts to bring in an exciting recruiting class with intentions of leading the Golden Flashes to the upper echelon of Division I competition. Leading the way are number 4 ranked Dustin Kilgore (174) of Ohio, number 7 ranked Brendan Barlow (285) of Ohio, number 10 ranked Nic Bedelyon (125) of Pennsylvania, and number 22 ranked Marcel Clopton (141) of Ohio. Two high-profile transfer students are Josh Rohler (149) from Penn State University and Obie Simpson (165) from North Carolina State University. Five other key newcomers include Ohio state champion Brian Dean (125) and Ohio state runner-ups Adam Hass (133), James Myers (149), Ross Tice (165), and Kyle Haddock (165).

**16. EDINBORO** – Three wrestlers have won individual NCAA Division I national titles for the Fighting Scots. They are Sean O'Day, Josh Koscheck, and Gregor Gillespie. Additionally, five Edinboro grapplers captured NCAA Division II national crowns. They included Dean Hall, Greg Wright, Matt Furey, Bob Kauffman, and Mike Hahey. Head Coach Tim Flynn continues to uphold the strong lega-

cy of winning and excellence that has long been associated with Edinboro wrestling. This year's fine recruiting class is highlighted by number 3 ranked Thomas Straughn (149) of Ohio, number 5 ranked Chris Honeycutt (184) of Ohio, number 8 ranked Paul Paddock (165) of New York, and number 17 ranked Aaron Ely (133) of Kansas.

**17. MICHIGAN STATE** – The list of past Michigan State University stars is exceedingly impressive. Names like Greg Johnson, Pat Milkovich, Tom Milkovich, Kelvin Jackson, Richard Dickenson, Gene Gibbons, Merle Jennings, Burl Jennings, Dale Anderson, Richard Cook, and Bob Hoke plus a bevy of others have proudly worn the Spartans school colors of Green and White. Head Coach Tom Minkel will bring in an outstanding recruiting class highlighted by number 1 ranked Eric Olanowski (125) of Virginia, number 4 ranked Collin Dozier (133) of Virginia, and number 7 ranked Ian Hinton (174) of Indiana. Other key newcomers include in-state Michigan prospects Anthony Jones (149), Phil Khozien (149), David Cheza (157), Curran Jacobs (174), and Tyler Dickenson (197).

**18. NORTHWESTERN** – Six wrestlers have won individual NCAA championships while competing for the Wildcats. They include Ralph Lupton, Jack Riley, Art Kraft, Mark Massery, Jack Griffin, and 2007 national champion Jake Herbert. Head Coach Tim Cysewski and Assistant Coach Andrew Pariano signed an excellent recruiting class that will provide some immediate and future firepower for the nationally-recognized Northwestern wrestling program. Highlighting the list of newcomers is number 1 ranked Mike Benefiel (174) of Illinois, number 12 ranked Robert Kellogg (165) of Iowa, and number 14 ranked Ben Kuhar (285) of Ohio. Two other in-state Illinois prospects are Frank Battaglia (157) and John Schoen (197).

**19. CORNELL** – Head Coach Rob Koll has firmly established the Big Red wrestling program as one of the most feared and successful in the nation by every measure. Six previous Cornell wrestlers have won NCAA titles. They include Travis Lee, Dave Auble, David Hirsch, Don Dickason, Frank Bettucci, and Glenn Stafford. Heading



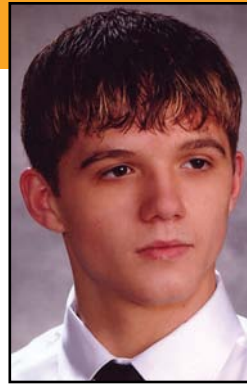

this year's recruiting class is number 5 ranked Eric McGill (149) of Indiana, number 7 ranked Cameron Simaz (184) of Michigan, and number 8 ranked Frank Perrelli (125) of Cornell. Other exciting newcomers are number 14 ranked D.J. Meagher (149) of New Hampshire, number 15 ranked Maciej Jochym (285) of New York, and number 22 ranked Colin McDonald (157) of New York.

**20T. MARYLAND** – Two previous Maryland wrestlers have won individual NCAA titles. They are Bob Kopnisky (1965) and Gobel Kline (1969). Head Coach Pat Santoro brings in an exceptional recruiting class led by a trio of valiant performers. They include number 1 ranked Eric Medina (149) of New Jersey, number 11 ranked Pat Strizki (125) of New Jersey, and number 19 ranked Brian Letters (165) of Pennsylvania. Three others to look for soon are Maryland state champion Will Sharbaugh (125), two-time Pennsylvania state placer Dexter Lederer (133) and New Jersey state placer Matt McLean (149).

**20T. IOWA STATE** – With over 90 seasons of success, few teams in any sport have developed the type of legacy of excellence that is synonymous with Iowa State wrestling. The list of elite performers who competed in Ames, Iowa is seemingly endless. Twenty-five of their many greats include Dan Gable, Cael Sanderson, Nate Carr, Tim Krieger, Carl Adams, Les Anderson, Ron Gray, Larry Hayes, Chris Taylor, Ben Peterson, Eric Voelker, Al Nacin, Dave Peckman, Bill Kelly, Dale Bahr, Mike Land, Kevin Darkus, Nate Gallick, Chris Bono, Jim Gibbons, Joe Heskett, Kelly Ward, Zach Roberson, Chuck Jean, and Kevin Jackson. Second year Head Coach, Cael Sanderson, a 2004 Olympic champion and the only undefeated (159-0) four-time NCAA champion, is quickly building upon the legendary greatness of his predecessors. He led the Cyclones to a fine runner-up finish at the 2007 NCAA Championships and mentored national champion Trent Paulson. This year's incoming freshmen class is highlighted by number 3 ranked Jerome Ward (197) of Illinois, number 6 ranked Tyler Clark (125) of Iowa, number 14 ranked Dalton Jensen (141) of Iowa, and number 20 ranked Andrew Sorenson (157) of Iowa. An exceptional transfer is former National Prep champion Justin Wren (285).
