#### SETTING THE SCENE

After winning its 35th EIWA championship and first since 2006, Lehigh is sending 10 wrestlers to the 88th NCAA Wrestling Championships at Quicken Loans Arena. Lehigh scored 164.5 points at the EIWA Championships, its second-highest total in history and crowned five individual champions, its most since 2003. Four of Lehigh's 10 qualifiers have wrestled at the NCAA Tournament previously, with senior Darian Cruz and junior Scott Parker earning All-America honors last year in St. Louis. Cruz won Lehigh's 28th individual national title at 125 last year and enters this year's tournament as the No. 1 seed as he bids to win a second title and become the 19th Lehigh wrestler to earn at least three All-America medals. All five of Lehigh's EIWA champions earned seeds, with junior Ryan Preisch (No. 3 at 184) the second highest Lehigh seed behind Cruz. Freshman Luke Karam is seeded 13th at 141 after his third place EIWA finish. The Mountain Hawks finished 12th last year in St. Louis and have crowned 11 All-Americans over the last four seasons. Lehigh will also be seeking its first top 10 team finish since 2012.

#### FAST FACTS

- Lehigh wrestlers rank sixth all-time in individual national championships and eighth in All-America medals won.
- In the last seven seasons, Lehigh has produced two NCAA champions, seven NCAA finalists and 19 All-Americans.
- Lehigh qualified all 10 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships for the first time in the qualification era (Lehigh entered all 10 in 1963 and 1967).
- Lehigh finished 12th at last year's championships with a pair of All-Americans
- Senior Darian Cruz will bid to become the first Lehigh wrestler since Mark Lieberman (1978-1979 to win back-to-back NCAA titles)
- Six of Lehigh's NCAA qualifiers earned top 16 seeds, led by senior Darian Cruz, who is the No. 1 seed at 125.

**THE 2017 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS  
SCOTTRADE CENTER - ST. LOUIS  
MARCH 16-18, 2017**

Junior Darian Cruz won Lehigh's 28th individual national championship to lead the Mountain Hawks at the NCAA Championships at Scottrade Center. After knocking off top seed Thomas Gilman of Iowa in the semifinals, Cruz knocked off Ethan Lizak of Minnesota 6-3 in a finals match between Lehigh Valley natives. Sophomore Scott Parker joined Cruz on the podium with an eighth place finish at 133 as Lehigh finished in 12th place with 40 team points. Seniors Laike Gardner and Doug Vollaro and sophomore Ryan Preisch all fell just one win short of earning All-American status. All seven of Lehigh's NCAA qualifiers won at least one match in St. Louis.

**LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO**

The 2018 EIWA Coach of the Year, Pat Santoro is in his 10th season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. Santoro led the Mountain Hawks to their first EIWA title since 2006 with their triumph at Hofstra earlier this month. Now a four-time EIWA Coach of the Year, Santoro has led the Mountain Hawks to a 135-44-1 dual meet record. He has coached 16 individuals to a total of 21 EIWA titles, 11 Mountain Hawks to a total of 20 All-American medals, and two national champions, Zach Rey in 2011 and Darian Cruz last season. A former Lehigh assistant, Santoro returned to Bethlehem in 2008 after a five-year stint resurrecting the program at Maryland, where he guided the Terrapins to an ACC title in 2008. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers' only four-time All-American. *(For Santoro's complete bio, see page 21)*

**NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS HISTORY**

Lehigh has the sixth most NCAA Champions (28) and the eighth most All-Americans (147) of all Division I wrestling programs. The Brown and White have never won the NCAA Team Championship, coming as close as second in 1939, third in 1965, 1979 and a tie for third in 2004. Lehigh has finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships 40 times, most recently in 2012 and has finished in the top five 16 times, with the most recent top five finish coming in 2004. Here’s a look at how the Mountain Hawks have fared in the NCAA Tournament under Pat Santoro:

Six Mountain Hawks appear in the latest post-conference tournament InterMat rankings while eight are ranked by Amateur Wrestling News, seven are ranked by The Open Mat and five appear in the latest FloWrestling rankings. Five Mountain Hawks: senior Darian Cruz, juniors Scott Parker and Ryan Preisch, sophomore Jordan Kutler and freshman Jordan Wood, are all ranked in the top 10 by all four outlets, with Cruz ranked first in three of the four polls. Freshman Luke Karam appears in three of the four polls. Junior Cortlandt Schuyler is ranked only by The Open Mat, while junior Gordon Wolf and freshman Chris Weiler only appear in the AWN rankings.

**A STRONG FALL IN THE CLASSROOM**

Lehigh wrestlers enjoyed a strong fall semester in the classroom, with 17 Mountain Hawks posting a grade point average of 3.20 or better last semester. Sophomore David Pipa led the Mountain Hawks with a perfect 4.0 semester in behavioral neuroscience. Sophomore Chase Gallik (3.94 in civil engineering) and junior Scott Parker (3.93 in finance) were not far behind, giving Lehigh three wrestlers over 3.9 in the fall. Gallik leads Lehigh with a 3.91 cumulative GPA. Eight of the 17 wrestlers with a 3.20 or better in the fall wrestled in at least one dual meet this season, including five of Lehigh’s NCAA Tournament qualifiers.

**BACK ON TOP: LEHIGH WINS 35TH EIWA TITLE, FIRST SINCE '06**

Powered by five individual champions, Lehigh claimed its league-best 35th EIWA championship and first since 2006 at the 114th EIWA Championships at Hofstra's Mack Sports Complex. Junior Ryan Preisch clinched the team crown for the Mountain Hawks, winning the fourth of Lehigh's five individual titles with a second period pin over Cornell's Max Dean at 184. Lehigh finished with 164.5 points, its second-highest point total ever, defeating Cornell by 18.5 points and snapping the Big Red's 11-year team title streak. Senior Darian Cruz became a three-time EIWA champion with a 1-0 decision over Cornell's Noah Baughman at 125, while junior Scott Parker made it back-to-back titles at 133 with a 2-1 decision over Cornell's Chaz Tucker. The Mountain Hawks' other two individual titles came from sophomore Jordan Kutler at 174 and freshman heavyweight Jordan Wood. In all, Lehigh had nine place winners and automatically qualified nine wrestlers for the NCAA Championships. Junior Ian Brown added an at-large bid at 157 to give Lehigh 10 qualifiers for the first time in the qualification era. Other place-winners included freshman Luke Karam (third at 141), juniors Cortlandt Schuyler (fourth at 149) and Gordon Wolf (fifth at 165) and freshman Chris Weiler (sixth at 197).

**LEHIGH SWEEPS INDIVIDUAL EIWA TOURNAMENT AWARDS**

Not only did Lehigh claim its first EIWA team title in 12 years, but the Mountain Hawks swept the four individual awards handed out at the tournament. Junior Ryan Preisch captured the Coaches' Trophy as the tournament's outstanding wrestler and also won the Billy Sheridan Award for the most falls in the shortest time in the championship bracket, with three in 9:53. Senior Darian Cruz claimed the John Fletcher Award for most career team points earned at the EIWA Tournament, with 89.0 over four tournaments. For guiding the Mountain Hawks to the team title, head coach Pat Santoro was voted EIWA Coach of the Year by his peers for the fourth time. With Preisch and Cruz sweeping the three major wrestler awards, it marked the fourth time (and first time since 1986) that Lehigh swept all three.

**MORE ON THE EIWA CHAMPIONSHIP**

Lehigh's 164.5 team points are the eighth most ever scored in the 114-year history of the EIWA Championships and the second most ever scored by a Lehigh team. In 1975, Lehigh crowned a record seven individual champions and scored 172.5 points. The only other time the Mountain Hawks cracked the 160-point mark was in 2016, when they scored 160.5 while finishing second in the EIWA to Cornell. Lehigh crowned at least five individual champions for the seventh time. The previous six Lehigh teams to crown at least five EIWA champions finished no worse than sixth at the NCAA Tournament.

**BONUS, BABY!**

Lehigh's ability to generate bonus points keyed the Mountain Hawks' 12-3 dual record and nearly led the Brown and White to an upset over No. 1 Penn State. The Mountain Hawks won 105 of 150 bouts in dual competition (70%) and have scored bonus points in 49 of those 105 wins (47%). Lehigh had 15 falls in dual competition, with junior Scott Parker leading the way with four, senior Darian Cruz adding two and nine others each adding one. The Mountain Hawks had just two falls in 14 duals last season (Ryan Preisch vs. Drexel, Randy Cruz vs. Virginia Tech). **Lehigh went 34-10 at the EIWA Championships with 16 bonus point wins (10 falls, one technical fall, four major decisions and one medical forfeit). The Mountain Hawks scored 27.5 bonus points in the tournament, and got off to a fast start, going 10-0 in the first round with seven falls and two major decisions among those 10 victories.**

**A FRESH START**

Lehigh's contingent of NCAA qualifiers features one senior, five juniors, one sophomore and three deferred freshmen. Seven freshman saw action for Lehigh during the regular season, with Luke Karam, Chris Weiler and Jordan Wood competing at the EIWA Championships and qualifying for the NCAA Championships. Over the last 41 years, nine Lehigh freshman have earned All-America honors in their first season of eligibility, most recently Darian Cruz (true) and Mitch Minotti (deferred) in 2014.

**CRUZ WINS TITLE TO LEAD LEHIGH AT SOUTHERN SCUFFLE**

Senior Darian Cruz won the 125-pound title to lead the Mountain Hawks at the Southern Scuffle, Jan. 1-2 in Chattanooga, Tenn. Cruz went 5-0 across the two-day tournament, picking up his 100th career win with a second period pin in his opening round match and scoring bonus points in his first four victories. As a team, Lehigh scored 102 points to finish third for the third straight year. Eight of Lehigh's 16 entrants placed in the top eight, with three others finishing just one victory shy of placement. Sophomore Jordan Kutler joined Cruz as a finalist but dropped a 4-0 decision to Penn State's Mark Hall in the finals at 174. The Mountain Hawks had two place winners at 165 with junior Gordon Wolf placing fifth and senior Drew Longo claiming eighth. Other place winners included freshman Luke Karam (sixth at 141), junior Ian Brown (seventh at 157) and freshmen Jake Jakobsen (eighth at 197) and Jordan Wood (eighth at 285). Fourteen of Lehigh's 16 entrants won at least one match.

**CRUZ CLIMBING THE LADDER**

With a 5-0 showing at the Southern Scuffle, senior Darian Cruz became the 16th member of Lehigh's 100-win club. With 11 wins post-Scuffle, Cruz is up to 116 wins, tying Zach Rey for third place on Lehigh's career list. With five wins at the NCAA Tournament, Cruz could finish as high as second. Jon Trengre '05 holds Lehigh's career wins record at 133.

**UPPERWEIGHTS LEAD LEHIGH IN FINAL HOME WEEEEKEND**

While the strength of Lehigh’s team usually lies in its light-weights, where NCAA Champion Darian Cruz and All-American Scott Parker reside, it was the back half of the Mountain Hawks’ lineup that helped cement home wins over Oklahoma and Pitt to close out the dual season. Lehigh won four close decisions in the first half against Oklahoma before turning things on in the second half. The Mountain Hawks trailed Pitt 10-6 at intermission before Gordon Wolf started a run of three consecutive bonus wins with a technical fall at 165 to give Lehigh the lead for good. In all, seven Mountain Hawks went 2-0 on the season’s final weekend including all five wrestlers from 165 through heavyweight. Junior Ryan Preisch recorded his first fall of the season versus Oklahoma and added a major decision against Pitt.

**POSITIVE REINFORCEMENTS**

The return of three injured starters to Lehigh’s lineup propelled the Mountain Hawks to a big 22-13 win at No. 8 Arizona State Feb. 9. Juniors Scott Parker, Cortlandt Schuyler and Ryan Preisch all returned after missing time with Parker and Preisch competing in duals for the first time since early December, while Schuyler was sidelined for two weeks. All three wrestlers won their bouts against the Sun Devils, highlighted by Schuyler’s 11-3 major decision over former NCAA Champion and All-American Jason Tsirtsis. Parker battled back for an overtime win over Ali Naser at 133, while Preisch posted a major decision over Kordell Norfleet at 184. Lehigh built an early 13-0 lead and won six of ten bouts in the dual at Arizona State.

**MOVIN’ ON UP**

Two returning Lehigh starters have enjoyed success wrestling up at new weight classes. Sophomore Jordan Kutler went 13-1 as a freshman including a Southern Scuffle title at 157 before running into late-season weight issues. He bumped two weight classes to 174. Junior Ryan Preisch enjoyed a breakout season at 174, going 25-6 overall, finishing second in the EIWA and reaching the All-America round of 12 at the NCAA Championships. Preisch is now up at 184, his third weight class in as many seasons (165 and 174 in 2015-16 and 2016-17). Kutler and Preisch are a combined 38-5 this season. Kutler is 24-3, while Preisch is 7-0 with four pins and two majors since returning to the lineup after missing nearly two months due to injury. Both wrestlers claimed individual EIWA titles at their new weight classes. Preisch went 4-0 with three falls to win the Coaches’ Trophy as the EIWA Tournament’s outstanding wrestler.

**BRAND NEW HEAVY**

Lehigh has enjoyed a run of quality heavyweights under Pat Santoro, beginning with NCAA Champion and three-time All-American Zach Rey, All-American Max Wessell and last year Doug Vollaro, who reached the round of 12 in his senior campaign. Deferred freshman Jordan Wood has taken the reins at heavyweight and owns a 19-5 record, while earning the No. 10 seed at the NCAA Tournament after winning the EIWA title at 285. Wood went 11-3 competing unattached in open tournaments last season, highlighted by a runner-up finish at the prestigious Midlands Championships. The Gilbertsville, Pa. native was Lehigh’s Deferred Eligibility Wrestler of the Year last season. On the freestyle circuit, Wood was a Cadet World silver medalist in 2014 and represented the United States at the Junior World Championships in 2016.

**PACKING THE HOUSE**

A Lehigh home dual meet-record 9,896 fans witnessed Lehigh’s 23-19 loss to No. 1 Penn State Dec. 3 at PPL Center in Allentown. The record crowd saw Lehigh race to a 15-0 lead behind pins from Darian Cruz and Scott Parker, only to see the Nittany Lions rally to win six of the final seven bouts, claiming several close decisions in the final four bouts to seal their 35th straight dual win. Four of the top five home dual crowds for Lehigh have now come against Penn State. The previous attendance record was 5,909 for Penn State’s visit to Stabler Arena on Feb. 12, 2016. The Grace Hall record attendance is 4,650 from a Lehigh-Navy dual on Feb. 4, 1967.

**LEHIGH HAMMERS NO. 4 MICHIGAN**

Lehigh capped its opening home weekend with a dominant 27-8 win over then-No. 4 Michigan Nov. 19 inside Leeman-Turner Arena at Grace Hall. The Mountain Hawks won eight bouts against the Wolverines, including three wins over nationally-ranked opponents. Junior Scott Parker earned his second pin of the season, while junior Ian Brown upset nationally-ranked Alec Pantaleo to help stake Lehigh to an 18-0 lead at intermission. Sophomore Jordan Kutler and junior Ryan Preisch added wins in battles of top 10 wrestlers at 174 and 184, respectively. The win over Michigan was Lehigh’s third against a top-5 team in 10 seasons under Pat Santoro. The Mountain Hawks also topped No. 1 Cornell in 2010-11 and No. 3 Ohio State in 2014-15.

**CRUZ, WOLF COMPETE IN ALL-STAR CLASSIC**

Senior Darian Cruz and junior Gordon Wolf represented Lehigh in the 52nd NWCA All-Star Classic, Nov. 5 at Princeton’s Jadwin Gym. Cruz held an early 2-1 lead in his exhibition bout versus Oklahoma State’s Nick Piccininni but a six-point reversal was the difference in an 8-5 loss. Wrestling close to his hometown of Lawrenceville, N.J., Wolf took on former youth teammate May Bethea of Penn in one of two showcase bouts. Wolf trailed 8-5 in the second period before hitting a six-point move of his own to rally or a 17-9 major decision. The Mountain Hawks have had at least one wrestler compete in the NWCA All-Star Classic in five of the last six seasons. Lehigh wrestlers now own a 17-16 record in main card bouts at the All-Star Classic.

**LOTS OF LOCALS**

Several Lehigh wrestlers didn’t have to venture far from home to wrestle collegiately for the Brown and White. Senior Darian Cruz and freshman Luke Karam both wrestled for nearby Bethlehem Catholic High School, the same program that produced Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro. Sophomore Charlie Sell (Bangor) and freshman Dan Moran (Northampton) are also from the wrestling-rich Lehigh Valley. Deferred freshman Jake Jakobsen hails from Stroudsburg, which is part of District XI and three Mountain Hawks: junior Scott Parker, sophomore Kyle Gentile and freshman Matt Parker wrestled for Pennridge High School, which is located just south of the Lehigh Valley.

**TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN**

Darian Cruz won Lehigh wrestling's 28th individual national championship last March, capping a 31-2 junior campaign with his title at 125. Cruz won his second straight EIWA title and avenged his most recent loss to Minnesota's Ethan Lizak with a 6-3 win in the NCAA finals to win Lehigh's first national title since heavyweight Zach Rey in 2011. He was also named EIWA Wrestler of the Year. A two-time EIWA Champion and two-time All-American, Cruz went 5-0 to win the 125-pound title at the Southern Scuffle, picking up his 100th career victory in the process. Cruz won his third consecutive EIWA title two weeks ago and earned the Fletcher Trophy for most career team points scored at the EIWA Tournament. He now owns a 116-18 career record and is riding a 47 bout winning streak. Cruz will bid to become Lehigh's 17th three-time All-American and its first two-time national champion since Darryl Burley (1979, 1983). The last Lehigh wrestler to win NCAA titles in consecutive seasons was Mark Lieberman, who did so in 1978 and 1979. Cruz earned the No. 1 seed at 125, becoming the first Lehigh wrestler to earn a No. 1 seed since Zach Rey in his 2011 championship campaign.

**SCOTTY STEPS UP**

Coming off a deferred year in 2015-16, Scott Parker enjoyed a breakout campaign in 2016-17, posting a 20-5 record and winning an EIWA title at 133 before joining Darian Cruz in earning All-America honors with an eighth place finish. Parker had an impressive 16-2 mark in the regular season and came back strong after missing time with an injury suffered in the finals of the Southern Scuffle. Earlier this month, Parker won his second consecutive EIWA title at 133. He is now a three-time NCAA qualifier with a 57-19 career record. Parker also won the Scholar-Athlete Award for Lehigh at last year's Lewis Wrestling Dinner and was a member of the NWCA All-Academic Team. He posted three wins over ranked opponents at the Journeyman Collegiate Classic, a showing which earned him the Hammer Award as the event's outstanding wrestler. Parker opened this season with eight wins in eight bouts and prior to his 4-0 run at the EIWA Championships, went 2-1 over Lehigh's final three duals after returning to the lineup after missing time with an injury.

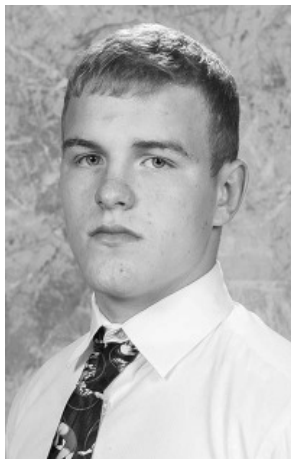

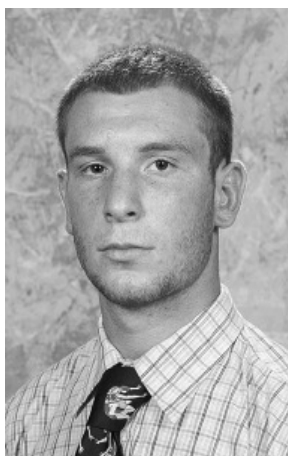

# LAWRENCE WHITE HEAD COACH - PAT SANTORO



Bethlehem native Pat Santoro enters his 10th season as the Lawrence White Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh.

A three-time EIWA Coach of the Year, Santoro has mentored two NCAA Champions at Lehigh, the second of which, Darian Cruz won the 125-pound title in 2017. He has led 13 individuals to a total of 16 EIWA titles, while guiding 11 men to 20 total All-American medals.

Darian Cruz's national title capped a successful campaign for the Mountain Hawks in 2016-17. Lehigh went 10-4 in duals and competed in the NWCA National Duals Championship Series for the second consecutive season, avenging a loss to Rutgers a year prior with a 23-10 win. Darian Cruz and Scott Parker won individual EIWA titles at the first two weights and both wrestlers went on to earn All-America honors, with Parker finishing eighth at 133 in addition to Cruz's national title. Lehigh finished 12th at the NCAA Championships. Seven Mountain Hawks qualified for the NCAA Championships with all seven winning at least one match.

Santoro earned his third EIWA Coach of the Year award in 2015-16. He led the Mountain Hawks to a 13-3 dual record that included Lehigh's first win over rival Cornell since 2011. The Mountain Hawks finished second at the EIWA Championships with lineup bookends Darian Cruz and Max Wessell winning their first career titles.

Lehigh crowned three All-Americans at the NCAA Championships for the third straight year with Wessell and Randy Cruz earning their first career All-America medals, while Nathaniel Brown became a two-time All-American.

In 2014-15, Santoro earned his 100th victory as Lehigh's head coach when the Mountain Hawks upset eventual NCAA Champion Ohio State at National Duals.

Lehigh's lineup featured just two seniors but a strong core of sophomores and juniors continued to impress. Randy Cruz won his

second EIWA title to help lead Lehigh to a second place conference finish. Nathaniel Brown reached the NCAA finals at 184 while Mason Beckman and Mitch Minotti earned All-America honors for the second straight year.

Santoro led the 2013-14 Lehigh squad through the ups and downs that come with a young roster. The young Mountain Hawks soared at the NCAA Championships with freshmen Darian Cruz and Minotti joining Beckman in earning All-America honors. Cruz and Minotti were Lehigh's first freshmen All-Americans since 2003 with Cruz also becoming Lehigh's first true freshman All-American in 34 years.

In 2012-13, Santoro helped guide a young Mountain Hawk team to ten dual meet wins. Three individuals won individual EIWA titles including Randy Cruz, who became Lehigh's first true freshman EIWA champion since 1980. Under Santoro's guidance Robert Hamlin became Lehigh's 16th three-time All-American and reached the NCAA finals for the second time in his career.

Lehigh continued to make strides in 2011-12. The Mountain Hawks finished eighth at the NCAA Championships for the second straight year and once again had two finalists in Zack Rey and Brandon Hatchett. Lehigh crowned four All-Americans, its most since having five in 2004. Robert Hamlin won his second straight EIWA title, while Hatchett won his first. Shane Welsh was the surprise of the tournament, capturing the title at 149 from the No. 6 seed. Lehigh's three championships were its most since 2006. For his efforts, Santoro was voted EIWA Coach of the Year for the second time.

In Santoro's third season Lehigh returned to the top ten at the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2006 with an eighth place finish. The Mountain Hawks crowned three All-Americans for the first time in five years and placed two wrestlers in the NCAA finals for the first time since 2003. Heavyweight Zack Rey became Santoro's first national champion and the 27th in Lehigh history.

In 2009-10, Santoro guided the Mountain Hawks to a 16-3-1 dual record and a top-ten national dual meet ranking for most of the season. In March, Santoro guided Rey to an EIWA title and All-America honors with a third place finish at the NCAA Championships, the program's first All-American in four years.

Santoro produced an immediate turnaround in his first season back in Bethlehem. The Mountain Hawks' 23-1 dual mark surpassed the school record for dual wins in a season. Santoro guided Seth Ciasulli and David Craig to individual EIWA Championships, while the Mountain Hawks qualified seven wrestlers for the NCAA Championships.

Before returning to Lehigh, Santoro spent the previous five years as the head coach at

the University of Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to his stint at Maryland Santoro served as an assistant at Lehigh for nine years, including eight seasons on Greg Strobel's staff. During his initial tenure, Santoro was part of some of the most successful teams in school history. In 2003, Santoro was named the national Assistant Coach of the Year by the National Wrestling Coaches Association, after helping guide Lehigh to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Before coming to Lehigh, Santoro spent the 1993-94 season as an assistant coach at Duquesne and the two seasons prior to that as a graduate assistant at Penn State.

Santoro has enjoyed success at every level of wrestling, both as a coach and a competitor. After wrestling for Bethlehem Catholic High School and taking a post-graduate year at Blair Academy, Santoro wrestled collegiately at Pittsburgh, where he became the Panthers' only four-time All-America while capturing national titles in 1988 and 1989 at 142 pounds. A three-time EWL Champion, he was the recipient of Pittsburgh's Golden Panther Award in 1989, recognizing the outstanding athlete of the year.

On the international scene, Santoro was a four time member of the U.S. National Team between 1995 and 1999 and served as an alternate for the 1996 Olympic Team. Santoro earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Pittsburgh in 1992. In addition to his Bethlehem roots and previous coaching stint at Lehigh, Santoro's father, uncle and brother all wrestled for the Brown and White.

Santoro and his wife Julie have a daughter, Leah and a son, Mack.
