## Record four Warriors earn NWCA Scholar All-American status

**WILLIAMSPORT, Pa.** – A school-record four Lycoming College wrestlers earned a spot on the National Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar All-American team, the organization announced with the release of its awards. Junior 157-pounder **Trevor Corl** (Howard, Pa./Bellefonte), sophomore 125-pounder **Shane Casey** (Catawissa, Pa./Southern Columbia), senior heavyweight **Tom Lynd** (Woodbury Heights, N.J./St. Augustine Prep) and senior 184-pounder **Bradley Miccio** (Bloomsburg, Pa./Benton) were honored.

To be eligible for the NWCA Scholar All-American award, a student-athlete must carry a cumulative GPA better than 3.20 or have earned a 3.20 GPA in the past two semesters and meet one of three criteria: qualify for the NCAA Championships, place in the NCAA Regional or win more than 66 percent of his matches.

Casey earned the award for the first time, as the 125-pounder earned the starting role and posted a 17-12 overall record with four pins and a major decision. The criminal justice major also finished fifth at the NCAA Southeast Regional to ensure his place on the team.

Corl earns the award for the second time after turning in a solid junior season in which he 26-4 with two pins and nine technical falls while splitting time between 149 and 157 pounds. He won the NCAA Southeast Regional at 157 to qualify for the NCAA Championships for the second straight year, finishing 2-2 at the event before bowing out in the round of 12. In three seasons with the Warriors, the business administration major has posted a 72-18 record with 12 pins and 23 technical falls, the second-most in program history.

Lynd picked up the award for the first time after posting a 12-4 record with 10 falls in his time as a backup to national champion Garrett Wesneski. The business administration major posted a 54-36 mark with 35 pins in his career.

Miccio earned the award for the first time, as the sociology major joined his cousin, Brandon Conrad, in the club, as Conrad earned the award three times from 2016-18. Miccio finished 13-7 as a senior, splitting time between 184 and 197 pounds. After dropping to 184, Miccio placed seventh at the NCAA Southeast Regional.

Lycoming finished 14-4 in dual meets under 26<sup>th</sup>-year head coach **Roger Crebs**, who reached 400 career dual meet wins against King's on Dec. 17. The team also finished tied for second at the NCAA Southeast Regional, the team's best finish since the NCAA moved to the format in 2013, qualifying four wrestlers for the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2001, finishing 13<sup>th</sup> at Division III's final showcase.
