She has developed a nationally competitive program. The Cardinals have been to two NJCAA World Series, finishing 2nd in 2007 and earning Williams a national COY award. NIC transferred into the NWAC in 2015 and has posted a 107-36 record in that conference. The Cardinals have collected an amazing 573 wins under Coach Williams. Her "academics first" approach has resulted in 10 individual NJCAA Academic All-Americans and 6 Academic All-American teams. Topics: Hitting for Success, Hitting Drills, Infield/Outfield Drills for Indoor Training</p> <p style="font-size: 0.8em; margin-top: 10px;">Mike has been the Head Softball at Capital High for 27 years, 24 as the head mentor. During that time his team has 342 wins; including 2 Class AA State Championships, 2 runners-up and a 3rd place finish. Capital High has 7 Western AA Conference titles since 2007. They have qualified for the State tournament every year under Mike. He has been named the MCA AA softball COY in 2004, 2009 and 2018. Mike will share experiences, discuss changes and lessons learned in his 27 years. He will open the discussion and welcomes input from attendees. Topics: Sessions 1: Unique Approaches for Player Comprehension and Communication with Athletes and Parents; Session 2: Offensive and defensive Strategies.</p> <p style="font-size: 0.8em; margin-top: 10px;">Jim Miller had a 37-year career coaching the sport of Wrestling, the last 22 years at Wartburg College, where his career dual record was 413-34. He won 21 consecutive Iowa Conference Championships and 10 NCAA Team Championships. In 22 years at Wartburg, Miller's teams finished 1st or 2nd in the Nation 18 times. He is a member of 6 Halls of Fame, was awarded the National D3 COY 5X and the Dan Gable All-Division COY in 2004 and 2013. As an Athlete, Jim Miller was a 2X NCAA Champion for the University of Northern Iowa in Division II, and a 2X All American in Division I. Coach Miller is now a nationally known corporate, athletic and leadership speaker.</p>
