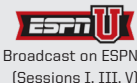

THE LEAD

Iowa State returns to Tulsa for the 2023 NCAA Championships March 16-18 inside the BOK Center. The Cyclones look to take the next step under head coach Kevin Dresser and are in search of their first top 10 finish since 2010.

KEY STORYLINES

- This marks the fifth consecutive season Iowa State has sent at least eight wrestlers to the NCAA Championships. The Cyclones are one of 15 teams nationally sending at least eight wrestlers to the tournament.
- Four Cyclones are seeded in the top 10 of their respective brackets. David Carr is the No. 1 seed at 165 pounds while Paniro Johnson and Marcus Coleman are both a No. 5 seed at 149 and 184 pounds, respectively. Sam Schuyler is Iowa State's fourth top 10 seed, coming in at No. 8 in the 285-pound bracket.
- Paniro Johnson (149) and David Carr (165) both won Big 12 titles two weekends ago. Carr is the second Iowa State wrestler, and first since Cael Sanderson in 2002, to win four Big 12 titles. He becomes the 11th wrestler in conference history to win four titles in the Big 12 era (1997-pres.).
- Johnson, a freshman, became Iowa State's first Big 12 Champion at 149 pounds and is the 24th wrestler in Big 12 history to win a title as the No. 3 seed or worse.
- Three Cyclones - Casey Swiderski, Paniro Johnson and Jason Kraisser - will be wrestling in their first NCAA Championships.
- Both Casey Swiderski and Jason Kraisser did not earn an allocation but wrestled well above their seed at the Big 12 Championship to punch their ticket back to Tulsa. Both placed fourth in their respective brackets, Swiderski as an unseeded wrestler and Kraisser as the No. 7 seed.
- David Carr has won 29 consecutive matches since his loss in the second round of the NCAA tournament last year.
- This season, Carr has 15 wins over wrestlers ranked in the top 25 of the coaches poll. The Cyclone has wins this season against the other top six seeds and is 16-0 wrestlers in the field.
- Twelve of Carr's 23 wins this season have come with bonus points, including a pin over Keegan O'Toole for a Big 12 title. He has 82 takedowns to his name and has only allowed three this season.
- Yonger Bastida is one of three international wrestlers in the field at this year's NCAA Championships. The Trinidad, Cuba native joins North Carolina's Lachlan McNeil (Toronto, Canada), and Harvard's Yaraslau Slavikouski (Rechitsa, Belarus) as the only wrestlers in the tournament who hail from outside the United States.
