

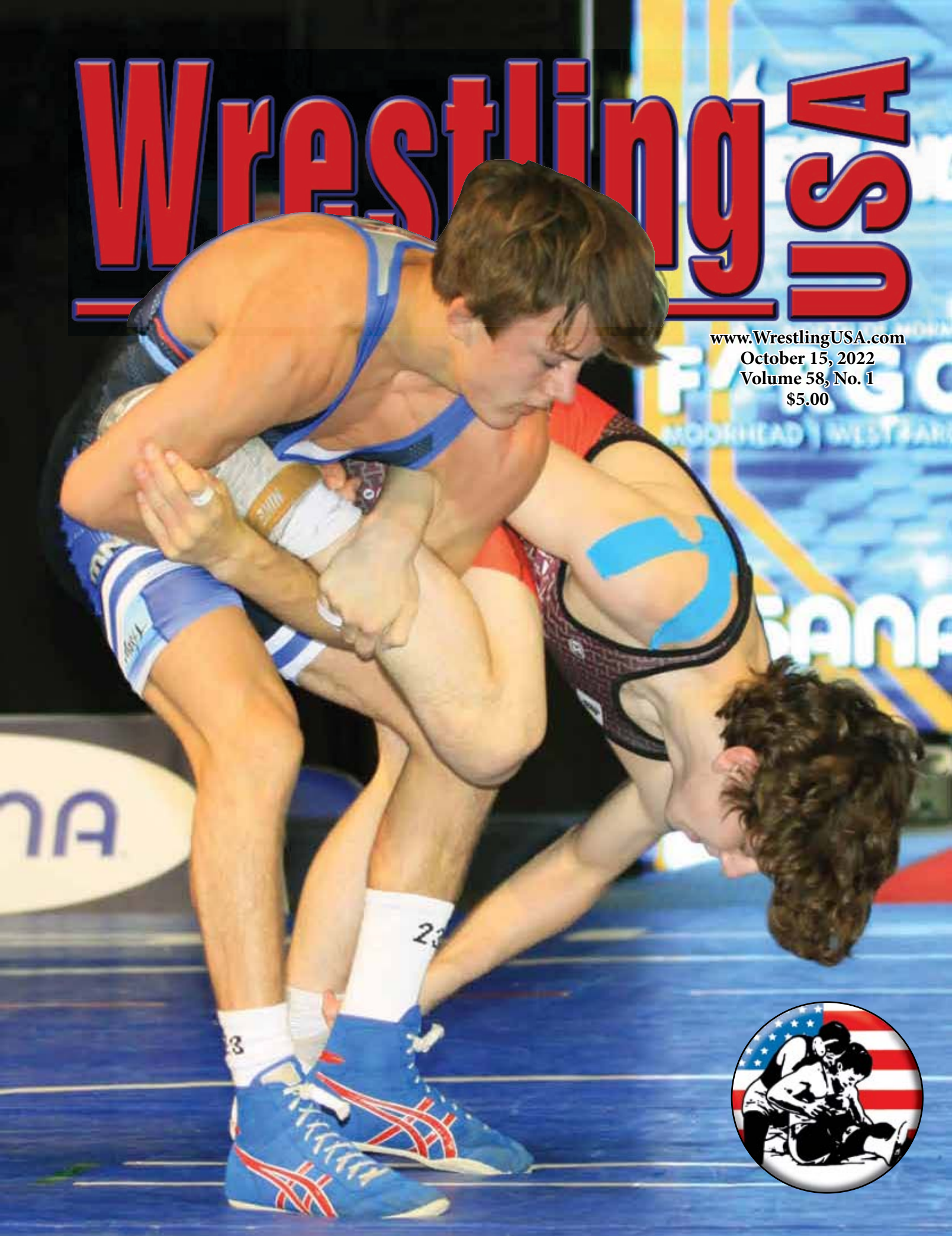

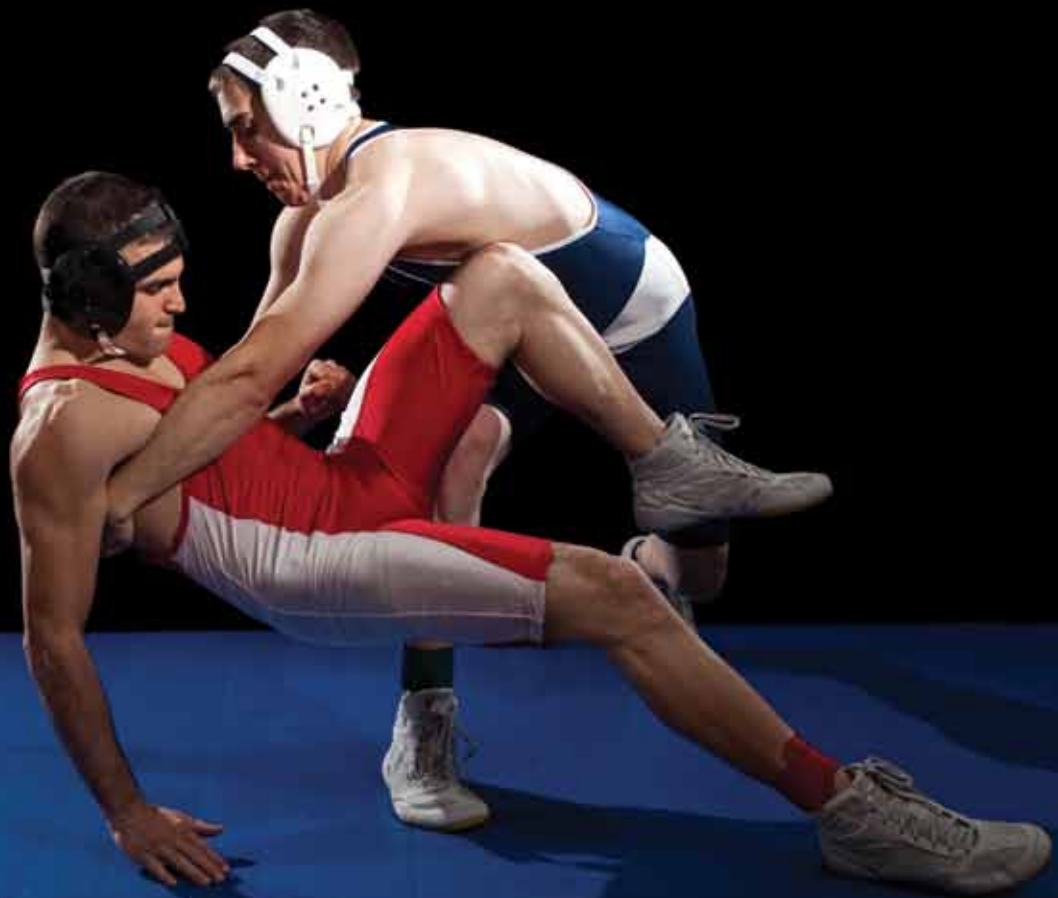

I have listed the three photo mistakes below. In all cases it was a photo identification issue; Matthew Singleton's and Michael Kilic's photos were swapped and Keith Miley's photo was missed completely (Kole Mulhauser had his photo in two places).

As we move forward towards next year's Senior All-American poster, we get a preseason preview of the possible senior candidates for next year with Dan Fickel's All-Class Rankings starting on page 6 of this issue. We all know that the wrestling season is long and very competitive, and we know throughout the year there will be several changes in the rankings.

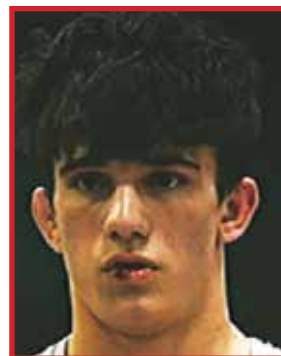

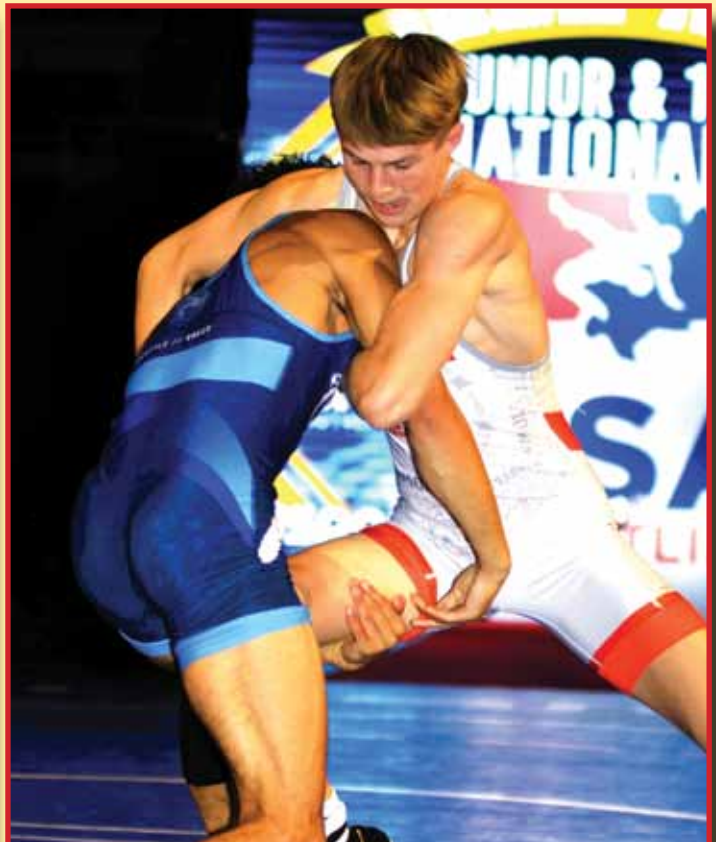

# Catching Up With *Vision Quest's* Frank Jasper “aka, Brian Shute”

**T**he character Brian Shute, played by Frank Jasper in the 1985 cult classic movie *Vision Quest*, has resonated with audiences worldwide for nearly four decades and from the start placed Frank's life on a trajectory that today has brought him full circle with the wrestling community, in addition to other opportunities. While pursuing a degree in Sports Medicine at Eastern Washington University, Frank was approached by his friend Rick Thiefaul about an opportunity. This was not any ordinary opportunity. Put simply, it was a rare opportunity to participate in a new movie playing an opposing wrestler (antagonist) to the main character, Loudon Swain, played by actor Matthew Modine. Frank had the physical traits (6-foot tall with a muscular frame) that the Casting Director was looking for to fill this role. Initially, Frank had no interest in trying out, but after ample convincing and encouragement, coupled by the fact that he could make some extra money, he decided that he would give it a try and audition for the part.

GAME DAY! When Frank initially met the Casting Director, he did not expect to have a speaking role. He assumed that he would only be an extra in a series of wrestling scenes. Having no prior experience, Frank was quite nervous, especially when he came to the realization that he had to memorize several lines for the audition. With a minimum amount of practice and some encouragement by the Casting Director to be more intense, Frank got through the first phase of the audition process. He was then informed that the Director of the movie, Harold Becker, wanted to meet him in person and observe a follow-up audition. The first words to come out of the Director's mouth were, “do you know your lines?” as he grabbed the script from his hands. This did not help Frank's nerves one bit, but he followed through with the task at hand.

Several auditions followed, one of which required demonstrating a sequence of basic wrestling techniques for Hall-of-Fame Coach Cash Stone, the wrestling consultant for the movie. At this point, they had narrowed their search down to two candidates. One being an experienced actor from Hollywood and Frank, an unknown college student. Although Frank was an experienced wrestler, the actor challenging him for the role also had wrestling experience. Having gone through a couple of intense technique drilling practices prior to the demonstration, Frank began to experience some pain and soreness, but this did not deter him from the big test. Being an experienced wrestler, he understood the rigors of wrestling and that he had to be resilient in the face of adversity. As requested, Frank and the Hollywood actor each exchanged a sequence of wrestling techniques for Cash Stone, which also had Harold Becker, producers, and much of the filming crew circled around the mat observing as well. The process lasted for a significant period of time, more than had been expected. It was back and forth, back and forth, and what seemed like an eternity finally

came to a halt. At this point, Frank was unsure whether he performed well enough for the part or would be sent home. Fortunately, when it was all said and done, Frank had impressed Harold Becker with his performance and to his surprise was offered the part of Brian Shute.

Fast forward two and a half weeks after landing the part, Frank is on set filming the scene where he steps out of a school bus with an intense look on his face in anticipation of his grand finale match against rival Lowden Swain of Thompson High School. Prior to filming, Frank had worked extremely hard to lose 25 pounds in order to be closer to Matthew's weight. From day one, he delved into this new job opportunity with the attitude that he was going to be in the best shape possible and perform to the best of his ability.

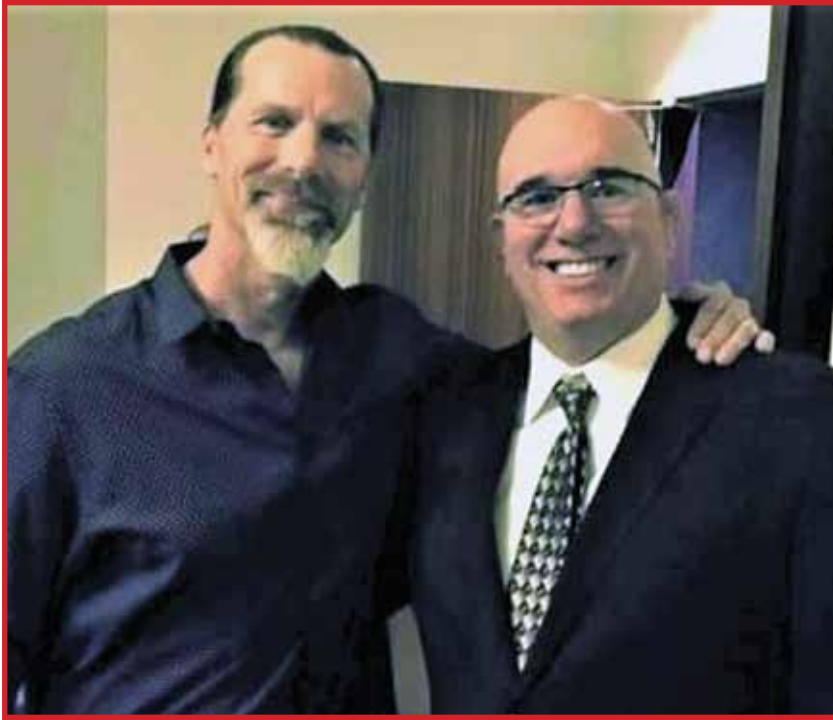

Who can forget the infamous scene where Shute carries a telephone pole up and down the bleacher stairs, a scene that remains the topic of discussion among wrestling fans today. According to Frank, this scene was shot in the early morning hours and the weather that day was extremely cold. Everybody on the set was wearing your typical winter wear, but he was in shorts and a tank top for the scene. Despite the uncomfortable conditions, it was worth the effort considering this became among the most iconic and memorable scenes in the movie.

It was at this point in Frank's life that a seed had been planted, and unbeknownst to him at the time, would bring him full circle several decades later with the wrestling community and a host of other opportunities. Unlike actor Matthew Modine, Frank actually wrestled in high school. He started out at JV in the 112 pound weight group and ended his senior year at 155 pounds. A 1977 graduate of Coeur d'Alene High School in the Northern Panhandle of Idaho, Frank continued his education at Eastern Washington University where he earned a degree in Sports Medicine, which included pre-med studies, emergency medicine and athletic training. He continued his education by earning a Masters' degree in Oriental Medicine from Yo San University in Los Angeles, where he also did his internship. He holds both California State and National Certificates in Acupuncture, specializing in sports medicine. Additionally, Frank is certified in Clinical Nutrition, Meridian Stress Assessment, Craniosacral Therapy, and Reflexology. Frank and his wife Sanda have been in practice together since 1993, first opening Osani Holistic Health Care in Pacific Palisades (SoCal) in 1995 and today reside and practice in Carmel, California.

Along with his practice, Frank holds a black belt in Aikido,

is a Reiki Master (healing technique), and has studied and taught Qi Gong (a holistic system of coordinated body posture and movement, breathing, and meditation used for health, spirituality, and martial arts training).

Having wrestled in high school and college myself in the late 1970s and '80s, I recall first seeing *Vision Quest* on the silver screen around spring of 1986 while on leave from a recent deployment overseas in the Navy (while on deployment, I read the novel version of *Vision Quest* written by acclaimed author Terry Davis, published in 1979). I recall it be very exciting, inspiring, and for the most part it resonated with me. Especially the character Loudin Swain and his journey against all odds to defeat a goliath of an opponent, Shute, all while dealing with the typical teenage challenges of peer pressure, low self-esteem, and distractions of having a girlfriend.

In 2017, I had the unique opportunity to meet Frank in person while attending the Red Carpet movie premiere of the *American Wrestler - The Wizard in Los Angeles* (LA) and shortly thereafter conducted a Q&A interview and followed with an article about his journey and experiences up to that point in his life. Not for one instant did I ever imagine I would have the opportunity to meet Frank Jasper "Shute" in person, let alone do a Q&A interview and article. It was truly an honor. Since our first meeting in LA, I have kept in touch with Frank. We often talk about wrestling, life, family, nutrition, and his involvement in the sport. Below is a recap from my previous Q&A interview and our more recent discussion about his current status in life, growing up in Idaho, as well as future opportunities he is working on with the wrestling community and more.

## **MAT CHAT Q&A WITH FRANK JASPER, AKA, BRIAN SHUTE**

**SINCE THE PREMIER OF VISION QUEST IN 1985, THE MOVIE HAS BECOME A TIMELESS CULT CLASSIC IN THE WRESTLING COMMUNITY. TAKE ME BACK TO THE MOMENT YOU WERE FIRST APPROACHED ABOUT TRYING OUT FOR THE PART OF BRIAN SHUTE. WHAT WERE YOUR INITIAL THOUGHTS?**

**JASPER** - I was just another student at Eastern Washington University (EWU) in the Athletic Training program and was assigned to the wrestling team. At the moment, I was studying one of my medical texts and sitting on a bench in the wrestling room, when an EWU wrestler (Rick), that was already an extra in the movie came and sat down beside me and started talking about the movie he was working on and how great that they were paying him to wrestle! Then he mentioned that they were still looking for someone around 6-foot-tall with a muscular build that could wrestle! That's you, he says pointing a finger at me as he just figured that out as it came out of his mouth. I was not interested, but he just kept reiterating how nice the casting director was and how much fun it had been so far. "Please just give her a call," was his last words as he shoved a piece of paper with the casting directors name and phone number into my hand. After considering what I had been doing for money to pay for my education (Bouncer at a Country Western Bar, Logger on a road building crew, etc.), I thought this could be cool, I can make some money and watch how a movie gets made, sounds like a "win-win" to me! Rick did not tell me some key things about the role, such as that they were 2 1/2 weeks from starting to shoot. That the role had been cast twice before and neither person worked out. That this character had lines (good thing I didn't know that) and that the character was the antagonist to the main character! I would not have even considered it knowing these facts! So, let's say the power of ignorance was very helpful in this particular situation.

### **WHAT CHALLENGES DID YOU FACE?**

**JASPER** - The biggest challenge was to maintain that weight and look for 10 weeks! But I had made a commitment to give this project 100% of my effort and then I could walk away satisfied even though I was not a professional actor. I was determined to be professional in all areas of preparation for my part.

### **WHEN YOU COMPETED FOR COEUR D' ALENE HIGH SCHOOL, DID YOU CUT WEIGHT?**

**JASPER** - Yes, I had to cut 3 to 5 pounds from time to time to make weight for a match, but most of the time I wrestled at my normal weight and was able to eat and drink into each match, which I preferred. Any time you deprive the body of either food or water you can no longer operate at optimal levels for any length of time. Strength and endurance are the first to go. And when the

body is starved, so is the mind. You don't make quick and clear choices. Does this sound like the best way to prepare for match? No way, so why is this still being done?

## **PLEASE EXPLAIN WHAT IT WAS LIKE GROWING UP IN COEUR D' ALENE IN THE 1970s.**

**JASPER** - Coeur d' Alene was an ideal place to growth up. My parents were hard working, dedicated to family, and great role models to me and my siblings. From a young age, I recall always being active. In the summer time, I spent countless hours boating, water skiing, swimming, and laying on the beach. In the winter, I snow skied, wrestled, and played many other youth sports and activities. I was your typical active kid growing up in the 1970s, always on the go from sunrise to sunset and beyond.

## **WHEN YOU PLAYED THE ROLE OF "SHUTE," DID YOU EVER IMAGINE NEARLY FORTY YEARS LATER YOU WOULD BE LOOKED UPON AS AN ICON OF THE MOVIE?**

**JASPER** - No, that thought never crossed my mind back then. I just focused on the job at hand, which was to project a battle tested completely dedicated wrestler's intensity. And I would do whatever it took to make that happen.

## **WHAT HAS BEEN THE OUTGROWTH OF PLAYING THE CHARACTER BRIAN SHUTE?**

**JASPER** - Playing the character Brian Shute in the film *Vision Quest* has given me much more than the unique experience of being part of a major motion picture; it also created a turning point in my life.

My involvement in *Vision Quest* took me to California, which became my home. I met and married the love of my life, Sanda, who is my partner in both career and life. I completed my education in the healing arts, specializing in functional and sports medicine. Today I am part of a wonderful community of family, friends and colleagues.

It is both surprising and humbling that over the 37 years since its release, there are young wrestlers around the world who continue to be inspired by *Vision Quest*. To have been a part of such an enduring film continues to be a great honor.

In 2015, I was asked to attend a 30th anniversary screening of *Vision Quest* and be part of a Q & A with fans afterwards. It was at that time that Sanda and I decided to find a way to join the effort to help grow the sport of wrestling. Working in Holistic Health Care, we help people in their pursuit of health, fitness and wellbeing not just physically, but mentally, emotionally, and spiritually as well. In a similar way, the sport of wrestling entails physical fitness while also building strength of character and integrity – a strong body and mind, steady emotions and an unwavering spirit. Recognizing the common threads in these very different pursuits, we decided to create SHUTE SHIRTS (shuteshirts.com) and make it more than just a place to get great tee shirts.

So besides the shirts that we designed, on this site you will find articles & interviews, as well as photos from the movie along with recent photos from different wrestling events. In "Health & Training

Tips," I share with you that I have learned over the years since *Vision Quest*. Often there will be insights from Sanda as well. Her work in helping people become more empowered by overcoming their fears can be an important aspect in achieving success in any training program. It is once again an honor and a pleasure to be reconnected with wrestlers and fans of *Vision Quest* everywhere!

## **DESCRIBE YOUR EXPERIENCE ATTENDING THE 30-YEAR ANNIVERSARY AND SHOWING OF VISION QUEST.**

**JASPER** - Very cool! I hadn't seen the movie on a big screen since the original premier back in 1985. My biggest concern was that it might not hold up. But I have to say I was pleasantly surprised. I still enjoyed watching it. Yes, the 80's music and hairdos date it, but the story of Loudon Swain's personal quest to find himself, and how he fits into the world, is timeless and still relevant in this day and age.

## **HOW HAS THE SPORT OF WRESTLING AFFECTED YOUR LIFE? WHAT LIFE LESSONS HAVE YOU LEARNED FROM THE SPORT?**

**JASPER** - It put me on my own "Vision Quest," and the journey continues! I guess wrestling is not done with me yet. Much of what I have learned is both literal and metaphorical. I have learned that

if I am going to commit to something to give it my all and to learn from my mistakes. To never give up, fight thru adversity, and go with the force not against it. I know that consistent hard work pays dividends and I seek to improve every time a new challenge presents itself...oh yeah, don't take yourself too seriously and never lose your sense of humor!

## **WHAT LED YOU TO THE PATH OF PRACTICING MEDICINE?**

**JASPER** - My love of martial arts was the beginning. Ancient martial artists were not only taught to fight, they were also taught to heal. This notion of warrior/healer resonated with me.

## **CAN YOU TELL ME MORE ABOUT YOUR PRACTICE AT OSANI HOLISTIC HEALTH CARE?**

**JASPER** - Our focus is Health, Fitness and Longevity - we always look at patients holistically - physically, mentally, emotionally & spiritually. We use a multilayered and individualized approach with each patient and client.

**JASPER** - About two and half years ago, Nick Suriano and his family came into my Osani Clinic in Pacific Palisades. Apparently, a family friend of theirs told them about my practice and since they were in the area on vacation thought it would be a great opportunity to consult me about improving Nick's diet, nutrition, and training regimen for optimal performance, both on and off the mat. After about a year or so working with Nick, refining his nutritional and energetic needs, I had the distinct opportunity to watch him in person compete and win his second NCAA title. Not only was it a great opportunity to witness the results of his hard work and commitment to his new training, nutrition, hydration, and training regiment, but to be a part of the process from start to finish was definitely a rewarding experience. Since my time working with Nick, other opportunities have come my direction. I am currently in talks with two NCAA Division I wrestling programs to possibly be their nutrition consultant.

The plan is to have a pilot followed by a series that is similar to the *Cobra Kai* concept with a grittier story line like *Friday Night Lights*. MORE TO FOLLOW.

I continue to do "Shute" appearances across the country, which I really enjoy, and am also in the process of working a business deal with a Stem Cell Company as a celebrity influencer.



# Girls Pinning Boys:

## A HISTORY AND EVOLUTION OF GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL WRESTLING

I wrestled in California all four years of high school from 2014-2018. I considered these to be the most productive years of my life so far because of the time and effort that I put into competing. Every day, every week, every month was a new challenge waiting to be conquered.

My teammates and opponents helped me to reach levels that I did not expect when I first walked into a wrestling room when I was eight years old. For the most part, I treasure these relationships to this day because each one, friend or foe, made me work hard. This was not always easy, but I persevered through the good and bad times. I can now look back at those years with great fondness.

I carry those experiences with me every day. The saying of *“once you’ve wrestled, everything else in life is easy”* is very true in my case. Faced with trials and tribulations, I can use my experience as a wrestler as a foundation. I know that success only comes through hard work. Even if I stumble, I will recover. I can fight to belong.

My junior year saw a transition from the co-ed wrestling team to a girls wrestling team at my school. Several of my earlier matches that I had in my freshman and sophomore years were against boys, however. I did not do very well in these matches, but I did have some success. Thankfully, all of my opponents in my high school career regardless of gender gave me respect as a competitor and focused on the wrestling match as just that, a wrestling match, and nothing more.

Looking back at the history of girls wrestling, I can see that the experience of other girl wrestlers was not always like this. Before the formation of girls wrestling teams, the only way for girls to compete was with the boys. Since 1985, when America Morris became the first girl to pin a boy in a varsity match, boys wrestling against girls has been treated differently. Decades later, in 2006, Michaela Hutchison was the first girl

to win a state championship in Alaska. These events received a lot of attention and celebrated the girls because they beat all the odds.

Other girl wrestlers in the 2000s and 2010s, however, often encountered a lot of obstacles and stereotypes when their only real goal was to compete in the only environment they were allowed to compete in. Boys were not always as respectful as they are now, likely because the occurrences of girl vs boy wrestling matches have evolved from being ultra rare to common.

Matches from this era show a wide variety of results, some very positive and some very negative. In this example from my home state of California from the 2000s, the boy’s frustration is evident for the entire match and he pushes his girl opponent likely out of hostility because he is unable to even get close to take a shot. Some may argue that he already knows his opponent is stronger and a better wrestler than he is, so he is only prolonging the inevitable. He will lose this match and there is no way to escape it.

In the boy’s home gym, however, there is a surprisingly large number of supporters for Rosey. Her family is filming the match and the number of cheers and shouts of support clearly demonstrate there are many in attendance who want to see her win. When the boy finally takes a shot and is quickly reversed, he may already know that he can’t escape what is about to happen to him. After briefly trying to avoid being pinned, he quickly gives up and simply lies there while the crowd cheers very loudly.

What drew my attention to this match was the reaction after the pin. The boy jumps to his feet and walks away as though he does not need to acknowledge the defeat. In his mind, either he was set up for failure or something happened that caused him to lose so easily that he cannot yet explain. So he walks off as though he is not even going to acknowledge Rosey’s victory.

Maybe he sees all of his teammates smiling and laughing from the

bench or his coaches looking at him. Or maybe he hears the crowd in his home gym. Or maybe he remembers the video camera. Or maybe he realizes his family and friends are there, or at least they will all soon see it.

While this experience is deeply personal to the boy in this match, it has been repeated on wrestling mats across the country for decades. It's no longer a one-in-a-million occurrence like it was in 1985. An increasing number of boys have lost to girls, and their reactions similar to this have been witnessed many times over. In this example, he is captured front and center.

He does return, albeit forcibly, and acts as though he is being forced to shake hands. If his opponent had been another boy wrestler, I can't imagine a reason for him to act this way. He likely would have fought back to avoid the pin more, but also would have simply shook hands and quickly moved on from the defeat in a respectful way if this had been the case. That would have been easy. This match, though, turns out to be unforgettable.

I think he's not ready to accept the reality of what just happened. He walks away, is forced to return, acts as though this shouldn't be happening, weakly shakes his opponent's hand, and then hesitates to acknowledge her team and coaches who are obviously celebrating wildly with great joy in her victory.

This was a common occurrence in matches of this period, which happened over a decade ago. The girl, who practiced and worked hard to even get to this match, is treated as though it wasn't really a fair wrestling match to begin with. Her opponent is frustrated and hostile, and he ends up paying the price for it. Her victory is definitely something to be savored, but the behavior of her opponent does nothing but distract from that.

I think matches like this should be celebrated even in retrospect because of the obstacles that wrestlers like Rosey had to go through

to be treated as equal wrestlers. The fact that the match is filmed so it can be preserved and shared on the Internet forever helps us to recognize these accomplishments that would otherwise be forgotten. We're lucky in this case.

Rosey should look back at this match and be very happy with her accomplishment, even today. She, like me, can continue to use her foundation as a wrestler to meet the challenges of everyday life long after she has graduated. She persevered, like many other girl wrestlers who came before her and will come after her. She won very convincingly in the match, but also in life.

Her opponent would not willingly look back at this match at all, but he'll be reminded of it. He might treat it with the same indifference that he did at the time, or he may find that it's not something he can ever brush off and stay mad. It is a constant reminder of losing to a better wrestler, a girl wrestler, and how she should have been treated differently. The match is on video, shared around the world on the Internet, and copied in several places. It will exist forever as a great example to others of how to handle a loss differently.

I am eternally grateful to the girl wrestlers who paved the way for those like me. Without their breakthroughs in the 2000s and 2010s to make girl vs boy wrestling more common and accepted, we would not have as many girl wrestlers today. And, since all of us can use the lessons we learn on the mat throughout our lives, many more girls are far better off today as a result.

Girls and boys alike, if they choose this great sport of wrestling, should act respectful both in victory and defeat. There is no place on the wrestling mat for disrespect or immaturity. When defeated, wrestlers should accept it gracefully regardless of gender and motivate themselves to overcome the defeat by working harder.

Those who can do this will be able to reflect on the challenges and success they had as wrestlers throughout the rest of their lives. It's an invaluable characteristic that cannot be vanquished. Those who cannot do this will not be better off because they will never be able to grow and move past their defeat.

Congratulations to Rosey and every girl who steps on the mat to prove that they belong.

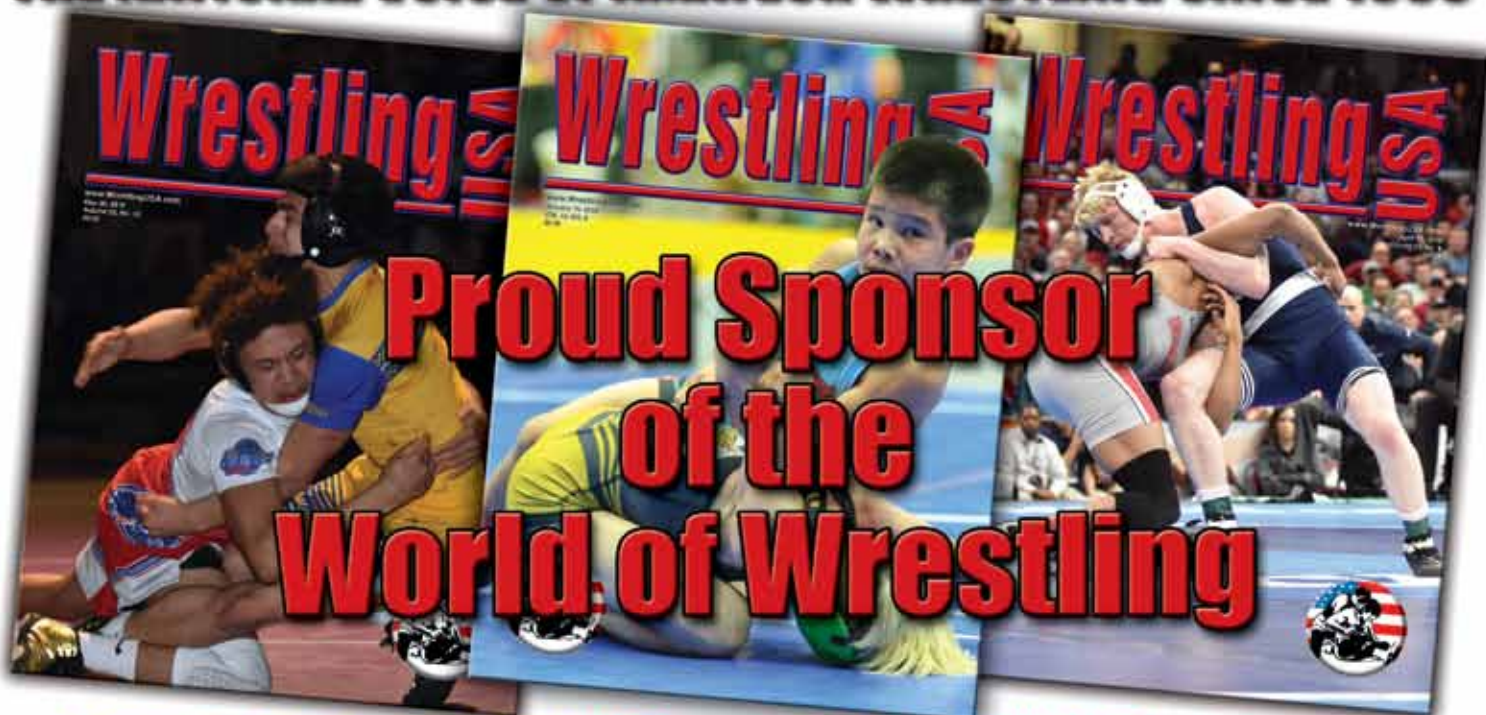

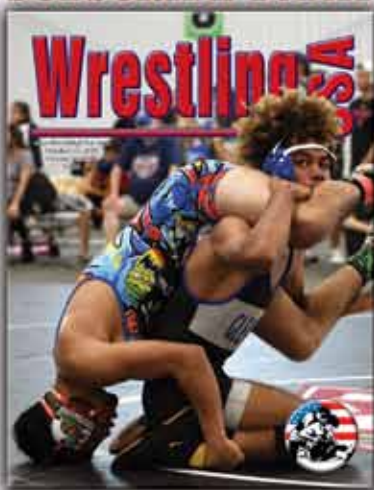

I have had several questions about how the All Star Team is chosen. I felt we should let you know the criteria we use. As you see, they are not just picked. They earn this prestigious position by wrestling in the nation’s Big Events! We are proud the events are looked upon as the best in the world. That aspect truly makes this All Star Team the top achievement a young wrestler can attain. We take this achievement to even greater heights with awards for each wrestler who wins each weight class.

Be sure to thank the companies that help us make this happen; FLO Wrestling, Nearfall, Wrestling USA and World of Wrestling. These people promote wrestling and your kids.

The following is a schedule of how the points are awarded for the World Series of Wrestling events to determine the 2023 All Star Team. A wrestler will be considered for the weight class he/she placed the most tournaments at. In the event of a tie, a wrestler will be put in the weight in which he/she earned the most points; however, all points will count. WOW will never encourage weight pulling.

## WOW Tournament Rules & Guidelines



1. Modified National Federation High School rules. Out of bounds will be modified college rules (a single body part of either contestant, within the wrestling cylinder.) Safety will be the main concern.
2. Minimum rest between matches and maximum number of matches not in effect. Exception: If requested, 6 and under through 18 and under will have a 10 minute rest period between matches.
3. Birth Certificates must be available if requested by a tournament director.
4. (1) Age Protest fee is \$40, and must be directed to tournament directors. All age protests must be made before final match of protested wrestler's first session of wrestling. Birth certificates must be available on the first day of wrestling for all wrestlers in case of a protest. (2) The video challenge fee is \$100.00 and must be presented at the mat table at the time of the challenge. Only the FLO camera will be utilized for the review. Video challenges are only allowed during semi-finals and all placement matches. The video challenge **MUST BE MADE IN A TIMELY** manner. If the challenge is upheld or video is inconclusive the fee will be returned. If the challenge is lost or the video is inconclusive, contestants will no longer be able to challenge for the remainder of the tournament.
5. Head gear is optional – however, highly recommended!
6. Hair cover is **NOT** required.
7. Child abuse, abusive language, disorderly conduct, etc., will not be tolerated and will be dealt with severely.
8. No cameras on floor of any kind unless approved by WOW.
9. Press or Media Passes must be pre-approved prior to entry deadline.
10. Coaches Passes and/or Floor Passes must be visible.
11. Must register under the exact same team name to compete for team awards and to receive Coaches Passes.
12. Total number of Coaches Passes determined by number of entries: 1 Coaches Pass for every 5 wrestlers registered together as a team. Example: 25 wrestlers = 5 free Coaches Passes. Free passes must be picked up during weigh-in! No Exceptions!
13. Must Pre-Pay & Pre-Enter – **NO LATE ENTRIES**. Must enter online.
14. Time Periods are as follows: 6-8 and under: 1-1-1 • 10-12-15 and under: 1 1/2-1 1/2-1 1/2 • 18 and under: 2-2-2 • All Consolation Matches: 1-1-1
15. Round Robin Ties – 1st criteria most wins, 2nd criteria head to head, 3rd criteria most falls (including Technical Falls). Any exhibition match does not count toward any awards.
16. Outstanding Wrestler Award – Based on a champion with most falls in least amount of time (including Technical Falls).
17. Must be present to win any Awards.
18. We reserve the right to make changes to the schedule as necessary. If any changes are made they will be posted at weigh-in and on social media.
19. A Trinity Award will be presented for any wrestler that wins Kickoff, Tulsa Nationals, and Reno Worlds. You do not have to wrestle the same weight at all 3 events, but must be in the same division. This is also offered for the Girls! We have the option to combine weights.

The purpose of this forecast is two-fold in nature: (1) to familiarize the reader with the possible participants in each weight class and (2) to stimulate discussion as to the outcome of the 2023 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships. This forecast will be affected by weight class changes, redshirt decisions, eligibility issues, transfers, wrestlers who may decide not to compete or defer enrollment, and injuries.

## 125 Pounds

Three-time NCAA champion Spencer Lee is the predominant figure at this classification. He possesses astounding knowledge of the sport and is an action-packed performer with big-time point-producing skills. Amazingly determined, Lee is accomplished in different wrestling styles and is two-time Junior World Freestyle Champion. He had a stellar prep career at Franklin Regional High School, winning three Pennsylvania state titles, three Walsh Ironman Tournament crowns, and two Super 32 Challenge titles.

Lee's principal competition will likely come from the exceptional All-American quartet of Patrick Glory, Michael DeAugustino, Patrick McKee, and Brandon Courtney. Glory, the returning NCAA runner-up, has won two EIWA Championships crowns and is proficient in the advantage position with great scrambling ability. He was a four-time New Jersey state finalist and two-time state champion for Delbarton School. DeAugustino placed fourth at the NCAA Championships and a former Florida state runner-up. He comes from a strong wrestling pedigree as his father and grandfather are in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. McKee has earned All-American honors on multiple occasions and is a whirlwind performer who can score back points quickly. He was a three-time Minnesota state champion for St. Michael-Albertville High School. Courtney, the 2021 NCAA runner-up, has won three straight Pac-12 Championships crowns and is very good on his feet with an assortment of aggressive moves. He was a three-time Arizona state champion for Desert Edge High School.

All-Americans Eric Barnett, Brandon Kaylor, and Killian Cardinale are formidable grapplers with great resumes of success. Barnett, a two-time All-American, won three Wisconsin state titles for Hortonville High School and was an impressive winner at the 2018 Junior National Freestyle Championships. Kaylor, a former Junior National Greco-Roman Champion, took second at the Pac-12 Championships and was a four-time Washington state champion for Bonney Lake High School. Cardinale won two Virginia state titles for Brentsville High School and is the defending Big 12 Champion.

Matt Ramos, Trevor Mastrogiovanni, Joey

Prata, Noah Surtin, Anthony Noto, and Malik Heinselman are wrestlers to watch in this division. Ramos won an Illinois state title while in high school and is a previous Cadet World Freestyle Champion. Mastrogiovanni possesses a variety of skills and is a former three-time National Prep Champion. Prata finished one win shy of the podium at the national tournament last year and is a previous Cadet National Greco-Roman Champion. Surtin, a former Cadet National Freestyle Champion, narrowly missed All-American honors last season and was the 2018 Illinois state champion for Edwardsville High School. Noto captured four New York state titles while in high school and is the defending Mid-American Conference Champion. He was an impressive winner at the 2022 U23 World Team Trials. Heinselman, a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar, is a multiple national qualifier with an excellent skill set. He enjoyed a decorated prep career at Castle View High School, winning three Colorado state titles, two Cadet National Freestyle Championships crowns, and a Junior National Freestyle Championship.

Redshirt freshmen with great expectations are New Jersey state champion Eddie Ventresca, four-time New York state champion Stevo Poulin, four-time Texas state champion Braxton Brown, four-time Oklahoma state champion Eli Griffin, three-time California state champion Richard Figueroa (Arizona State), two-time Maryland state champion Cooper Flynn (Virginia Tech), and two-time Minnesota state champion Blake West (Northern Illinois).

Other noteworthy contenders include Big Ten placers Dylan Shawver, Robert Howard, and Liam Cronin, 2020 NWCA

## 133 Pounds

This is a tremendously competitive classification that features a two-time NCAA champion, a three-time national runner-up, and a multitude of returning All-Americans.

Two-time defending NCAA champion Roman Bravo-Young returns in pursuit of his third national championship. Sensationally quick and inventive, Bravo has won two consecutive Big Ten titles and is an electrifying takedown artist with a penchant for scoring bonus points. He enjoyed a legendary prep career at Sunnyside High School that included four Arizona state titles, two National High School

Championships crowns, and a flawless overall record of 182-0.

Daton Fix, Vito Arujau, Michael McGee, Lucas Byrd, and Chris Cannon are multiple All-Americans looking to claim the national championship. Fix is a three-time NCAA runner-up and three-time Big 12 Champion. He is accomplished on the international level and was the recipient of the coveted national Dave Schultz High School Excellence Award in 2017. A silver medalist at the 2021 World Championships, Fix fashioned an amazing prep career at Charles Page High School, winning four Oklahoma state titles, a Junior National Freestyle Championship, Cadet Freestyle and Greco-Roman Championships titles, and he compiled a perfect record of 168-0. Arujau, the defending EIWA Champion and previous Olympic Team Trials runner-up, is an exciting wrestler with unbelievable balance and a wonderful set of moves. He enjoyed an illustrious prep career at Syosett High School, winning four New York state titles, a Cadet National Freestyle Championship, and a Super 32 Challenge title. McGee was triumphant at the Pac-12 Championships and is a former two-time Illinois state champion. He is a big-time point-producer with a myriad of slick techniques. Byrd took fourth at the Big Ten Championships and combines exceptional mat presence with great strength and power. He won a pair of Ohio state titles for Cincinnati La Salle High School. Cannon is a complete wrestler, very good in all three positions. He was a two-time National Prep Champion for Blair Academy.

Rayvon Foley, Taylor LaMont, and Sam Latona have made the All-American podium in the past and should not be overlooked. Foley, a former Michigan state champion, is an experienced performer who finds ways to make things happen on the mat. LaMont, a multiple Greco-Roman National Team member, is a transfer from Utah Valley University. He was a four-time Utah state champion for Maple Mountain High School. Latona was victorious at the 2021 Atlantic Coast Conference Championships and registered a fine prep career at Thompson High School, winning an Alabama state crown and a Junior National Freestyle Championship.

Two 2020 NWCA All-Americans with impressive backgrounds are Micky Phillippi and Michael Colaiocco. Phillippi is a four-time Atlantic Coast Conference finalist and a two-time champion. He won three Pennsylvania state titles while in high school and is an acrobatic performer with superb scrambling ability. Colaiocco is a flashy performer with a wide repertoire of moves. He put together a sensational prep career at Blair Academy, winning two National Prep Championships titles, a Junior National Freestyle Championship, and a Walsh Ironman Tournament title.

Dylan Ragusin, Brody Teske, Kai Orine, Jaime Hernandez, Chance Rich, Kyle Biscoglia, Joe Heilmann, Josh Koderhandt, and Haiden Drury are solid competitors capable of making an impact at this weight class. Ragusin, a former two-time Illinois state champion, came up one match short of All-American status last year and has an up-tempo style. Teske, a transfer from the University of Northern Iowa, seized top honors at the 2021 Big 12 Championships and was a four-time Iowa state champion for Fort Dodge High School. He will have to rank with Cullan Schriever to represent the Hawkeyes at this classification. Schriever excels on his feet with a variety of set-ups and slick takedowns. He put together a decorated prep career at Mason City High School, winning three Iowa state titles, Cadet and Junior National Freestyle Championships crowns, and a Super 32 Challenge title. Orine placed third at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships and is a previous three-time Missouri state champion. Hernandez has a lot of experience and is a former three-time Illinois state medalist. Rich has placed

A super experienced, entertaining performer, Matthews was a two-time Pennsylvania state champion for Reynolds High School.

Real Woods, Jake Bergeland, and CJ Composto claimed All-American honors at last year's NCAA Championships by placing sixth, seventh, and eighth respectively. Woods, a transfer from Stanford University, is a two-time Pac-12 Champion and three-time NWCA Scholar All-American. He is unbelievably quick and aggressive and was a three-time Illinois state champion for Montini Catholic High School. Bergeland placed third at the Big Ten Championships and is a hard-working competitor with exceptional strength. He was the 2016 Minnesota state champion for Centennial High School. Composto took second at the EIWA Championships and was chosen as the EIWA Freshman of the Year. He is solid on his feet and on the mat.

Andrew Alirez, Sammy Alvarez, and Mosha Schwartz were named 2020 NWCA All-Americans and are well-regarded competitors. Alirez became his school's first Big 12 Champion last year and is a rugged grappler with an astonishing set of moves. He won four Colorado state titles while in high school and was an impressive winner at the 2020 U.S. Senior Nationals. Alvarez seized top honors at the 2020 Southern Scuffle and was the 2019 New Jersey state champion for St. Joseph Regional High School. Schwartz won two Colorado state titles while in high

He can catch his opponents off guard with his constant pursuit of the fall and is the defending Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational Champion. Hart placed second at the Big 12 Championships and is a three-time NCAA qualifier. He won an Ohio state title while in high school and was victorious at the 2016 NHSCA Junior National Championships. D'Emilio competes with a great amount of intensity and was a four-time Ohio state champion for Genoa High School. Bartlett recorded a magnificent prep career at Wyoming Seminary, winning four National Prep Championships titles and a Walsh Ironman Tournament crown. He possesses fascinating quickness and was a bronze medalist at the 2021 UWW Junior World Championships. Ryan Jack is the younger brother of former Wolfpack three-time All-American Kevin Jack. A previous four-time Connecticut state champion, Ryan placed second at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships and was second in freestyle at the 2022 U20 World Team Trials. Droegemueller took fourth at the Big 12 Championships and is a solid performer from an accomplished wrestling family. Kazimer seized top honors at the EIWA Championships and was the 2018 Ohio state runner-up for St. Edward High School. Young was a gold medalist at the 2021 Junior Pan American Championships and is a former three-time Oklahoma state champion. He is particularly good on his feet with a superb set of moves. Bell placed second at the 2021 Mid-American Conference Championships and was the 2020 New Jersey state runner-up for Kingsway High School. Hines won three Florida state titles while in high school and was the 2021 EIWA Champion. He will have to rank with Connor McGonagle to earn the starting position in Lehigh's talented line-up. McGonagle is a two-time NCAA qualifier and was a four-time New Hampshire state champion for Timberlane High School.

Four intriguing redshirt freshmen are Lachlan McNeil, Ethen Miller, Jordan Titus (West Virginia), and Teague Travis (Oklahoma State). McNeil enjoyed a sterling prep career at Wyoming Seminary, claiming a National Prep Championships title, a Walsh Ironman Tournament crown, and a first-place

He was an impressive winner at the Final X New York Series to make his second consecutive freestyle Senior World Team. A two-time gold medalist at the Cadet World Freestyle Championships, Diakomihalis registered a legendary prep career at Hilton High School, winning four New York state crowns and three Super 32 Challenge titles.

All-Americans Ridge Lovett, Austin Gomez, Sammy Sasso, Brock Mauller, and Jonathan Millner are superstar performers who will challenge for the national title. Lovett, the returning NCAA runner-up, is an action-packed wrestler who can score points from numerous positions on the mat. He was a four-time Idaho state champion for Post Falls High School. Gomez was victorious at the Big Ten Championships and is an ultra-swift performer who really shines on his feet. His magnificent high school career included three Illinois state titles, a Junior National Freestyle Championship, and Cadet National Freestyle and Greco-Roman titles. Sasso seized top honors at the 2021 Big Ten Championships and was the 2021 NCAA runner-up. He won two Pennsylvania state titles for Nazareth High School and was the 2019 UWW Junior National Freestyle Champion. Mauller is a three-time Mid-American Conference Champion and was a four-time Missouri state champion for Father Tolton High School. Millner, a freestyle U23 World Team Trials runner-up, is a two-time All-American and two-time Southern Conference Champion. He was the 2017 North Carolina state champion for Ben L Smith High School.

Kyle Parco, Vayha Thomas, Dom Demas, Jaden Abas, and Zach Sherman have reached the All-American podium previously and should not be underestimated. Parco, a two-time All-American and NWCA Scholar All-American, possesses a variety of techniques and is the defending Pac-12 Champion. He was the 2019 California state champion for De La Salle High School. Thomas placed third at the 2021 NCAA Championships and is an intelligent, exciting wrestler who finds all kinds of ways to win. Demas, a transfer from Oklahoma University, has captured two

He won two California state titles for Rancho Bernardo High School and comes from a strong family lineage. Artalona, a previous four-time Florida state champion and two-time Junior National Freestyle Champion, narrowly missed All-American honors last year and was the 2019 EIWA Champion. Realbuto placed third at the Big 12 Championships and is the younger brother of 2015 NCAA finalist Brian Realbuto. A former UWW Junior Freestyle Champion and Junior Pan American Championships gold medalist, O'Connor is a vastly experienced four-time All-

Kharchla is an elite technician with great mat presence. He enjoyed an impressive prep career at Olentangy Liberty High School, winning two Ohio state titles, a Junior National Freestyle Championship, and a Walsh Ironman Tournament title. Possessing a strong wrestling pedigree, Carson's father, Miron, was the 1995 NAIA National Champion for the University of Findlay. Hall placed second at the Big 12 Championships and was a runner-up at the U23 World Team Trials. state titles for Simley High School and was victorious at the 2017 Cadet World Freestyle Championships. Parris is a powerful performer with a relentless style and excellent pin production. A gold medalist at the 2019 Junior World Championships, Parris possesses great athleticism and was a three-time Indiana state champion for Lawrenceburg High School. Davison collected an Indiana state title while in high school and is good on his feet with a variety of takedown maneuvers. An impressive winner at the 2018 Junior National Freestyle Championships, Davison comes from a strong wrestling family lineage. His father, Keith, was a two-time All-American at the University of Wisconsin. Cassioppi took second at the Big Ten Championships is a rapid-fire pinner with a punishing, physical style. He was a three-time Illinois state champion for Hononegah High School.

Tate Orndorff and Trent Hillger have reached the All-American podium in the past and are big-time performers who should not be underestimated. Orndorff has placed at the Big Ten Championships on two occasions and is a former two-time Washington state champion. From an accomplished wrestling family, Orndorff's father, Dave, was the 1988 NCAA runner-up for Oregon State University. Hillger won three Michigan state titles while in high school and excels in the advantage position with a variety of leg rides and pin holds.

Yaraslau Slavikowski, Wyatt Hendrickson, Zach Elam, Lewis Fernandes, Luke Luffman, Taye Ghadiali, and Tyrie Houghton are outstanding wrestlers with All-American goals. Slavikowski, a 2020 NWCA All-American, finished second at the 2021 Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational and was a bronze medalist at the 2021 Belarus Senior Nationals. Hendrickson took first-place honors at the Big 12 Championships and is a big-time pinner. He was a two-time Kansas state champion for Newton High School. Elam placed third at the Big 12 Championships and was a three-time Missouri state champion for Staley High School. Fernandes finished second at the EIWA Championships and was a two-time New Jersey state champion for Voorhees High School. Luffman won titles in freestyle and Greco-Roman at the 2019 Junior National Championships. He was a three-time Illinois state champion for Urbana High School. Ghadiali won a Michigan state title while in high school and is the defending Southern Conference Champion. Houghton placed second at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships and was the 2018 North Carolina state champion for Weddington High School.

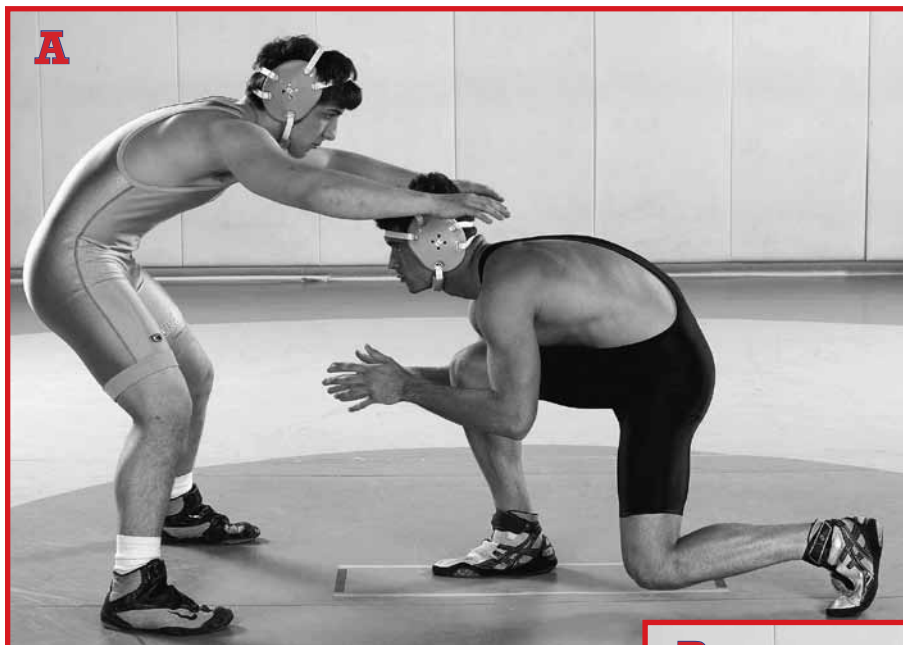

# Double-Leg Trip

By Bill Welker



## Setup

W2 reaches for W1 in the neutral position (a).

## Action

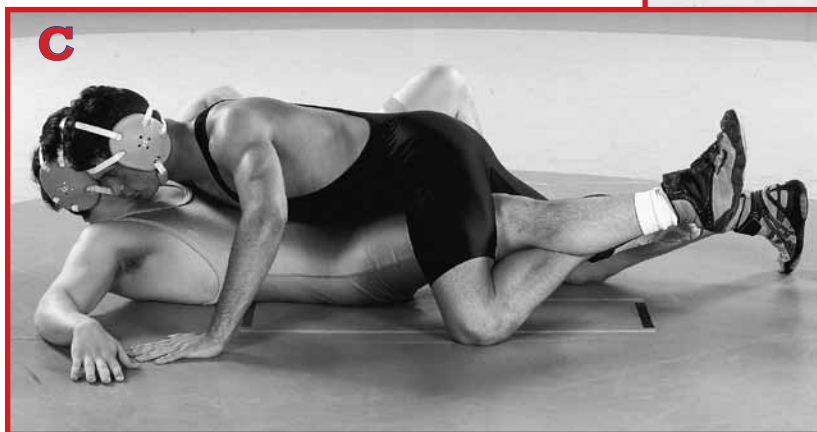
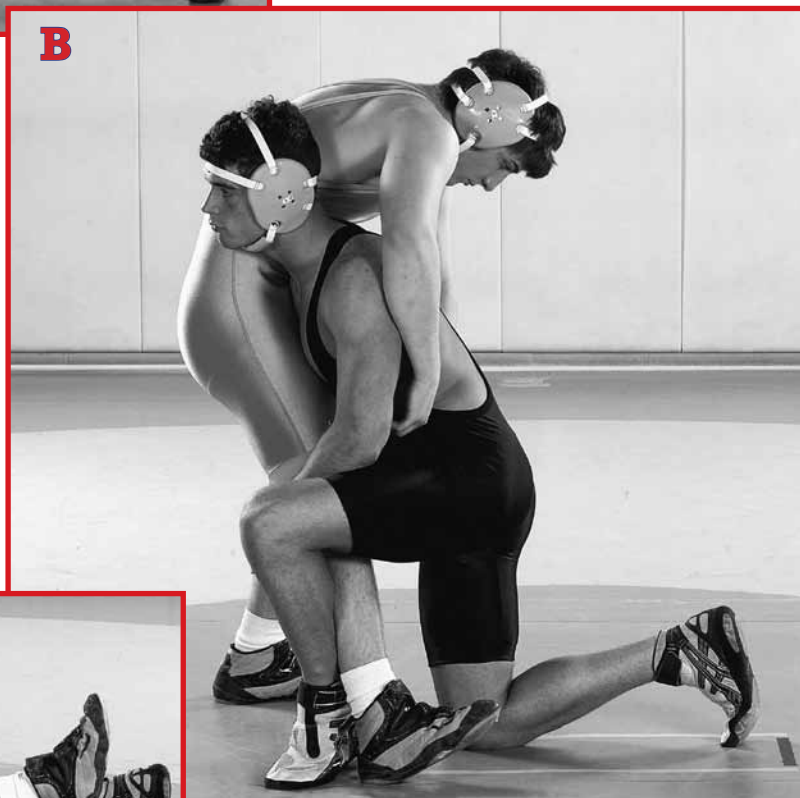
W1 deeply penetrates W2's defenses, hooking W2's right leg with his left leg while shooting the double-leg takedown (a and b). As they drop to the mat, W1 quickly releases his arms around W2's legs as he prepares to adjust to a ride or pinning combination (c).

## Coaching Points

The wrestlers must be taught not to allow their upper body to trail their trip leg, or they will be placed in an off-balance position. Emphasis should also be on whipping the trip leg back as they shoulder drive through their opponents for the double-leg takedown.

## Common Error

A very common mistake is that the attacking wrestler does not drive his shoulder into his opponent's mid-section while driving him to his back.

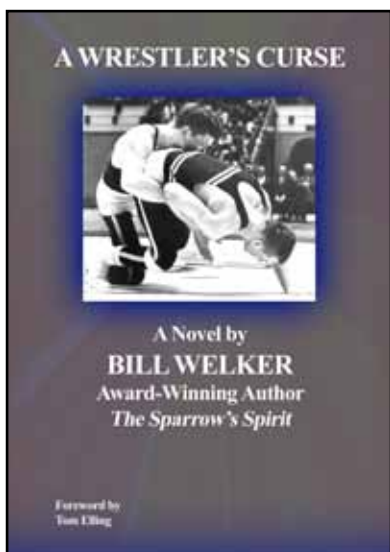
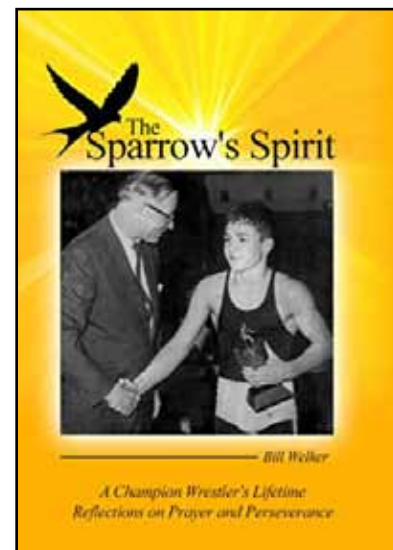
## THE SPARROW'S SPIRIT

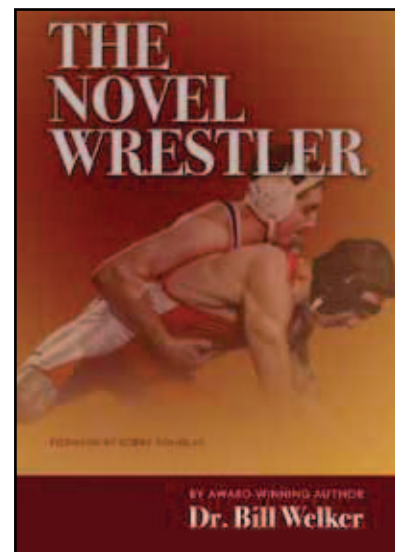
