SHARI OSLOS and HEATHER STEVENSON both exemplify the ideal in wrestling managers. Oslos, a senior at Minnesota State University-Moorhead, and Stevenson, a senior at J.F.K. High School (Iselin, NJ), are essential components in the programs they serve.

Shari came to Minnesota-Moorhead after serving four years as manager at national powerhouse Apple Valley High School. She has found time in college to continue her service to wrestling while playing college volleyball and doing her student teaching. Her duties ranged from the usual keeping of team and individual statistics, operating the whistle and stop-watch at practice, keeping the scorebook, to essential college program duties like making hotel reservations for away matches, securing referees for matches, and conducting tours for visiting recruits.



Heather, who started four years ago after encouragement by her older sister, quickly found herself enamored with the sport. According to Head Coach Mike Volpe, who nominated her, Stevenson "is a joy to have around. Her contributions to the team and to me personally cannot be overstated. She understands the wrestling 'hard work' ethic. She is not the type of person one can replace."

In addition to the usual managerial duties, for the past two years Stevenson has served as assistant tournament director for J.F.K.'s invitational tournament.

She also maintains a 3.5 grade point average and is a member of National Honor Society. In addition she was starting catcher on the softball team and served as cheerleading captain.

Heather's commitment to the sport is exemplified by the fact that, upon learning there were going to be conflicts between her cheerleading competition schedule and the wrestling schedule, she made the difficult decision of giving up the cheerleading. "Wrestling is infectious," she says. "For four years I've watched how hard my friends work out there on the mat. There was no question about what I would be giving up."
